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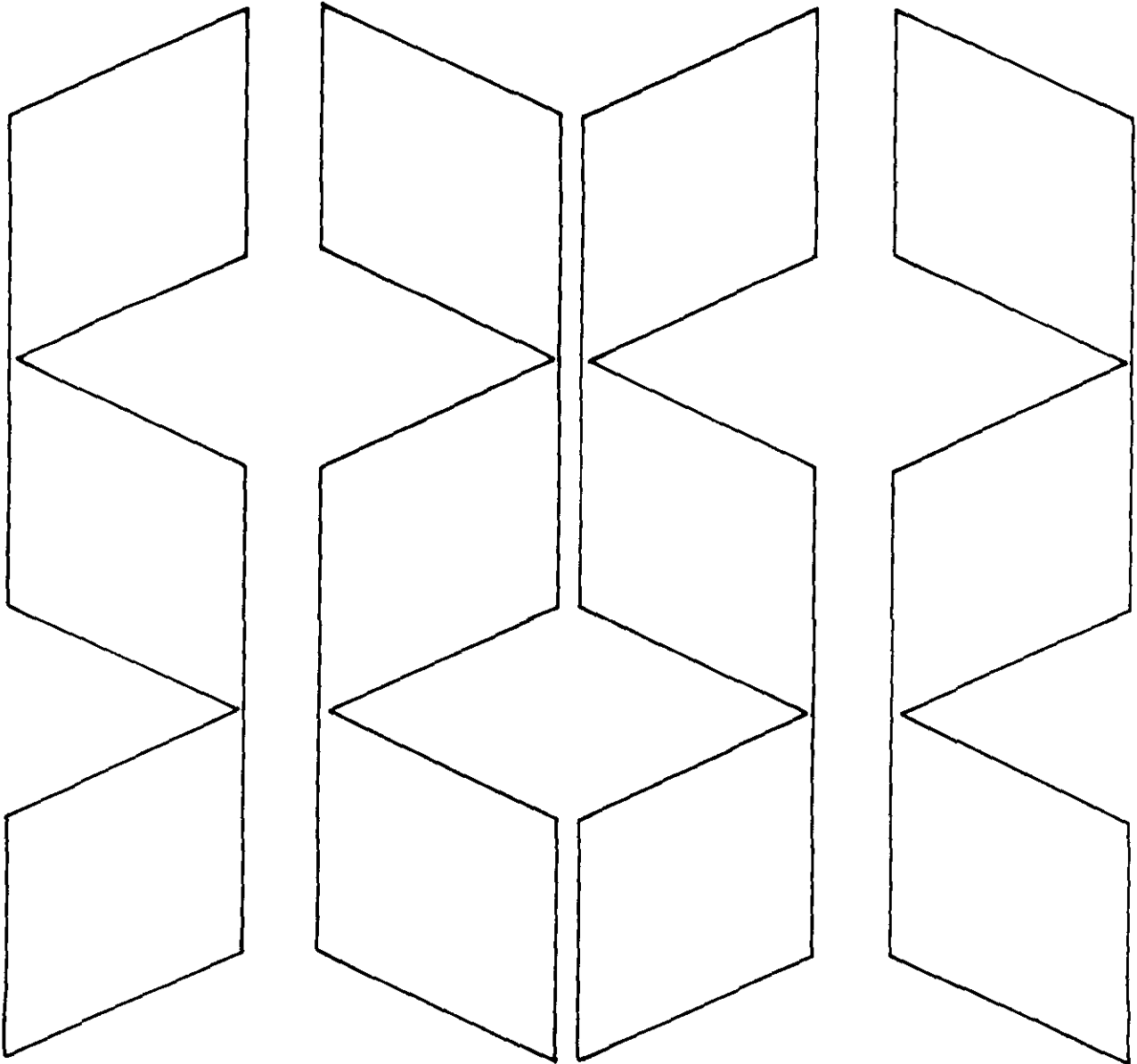

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Meat Animals Production, Disposition and Income

1988 Summary



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DEFINITIONS

INVENTORY, SUPPLY AND DISPOSITION: Balance sheet estimates; the sum of inventory on hand beginning of year, births and inshipments equals the sum of marketings, farm slaughter, deaths and inventory on hand end of year.

INSHIPMENTS: Livestock shipped into States for feeding or breeding. Excludes livestock brought in for immediate slaughter.

MARKETINGS: Includes animals for slaughter market, as well as younger animals shipped to other States for feeding or breeding purposes. Excludes interfarm sales within the State and farm slaughter. Number of head marketed includes all custom slaughter but live weight marketings (shown in pounds) excludes custom slaughter consumed on farms where produced.

FARM SLAUGHTER: Animals slaughtered on farms primarily for home consumption. Excludes custom slaughter for farmers at commercial establishments.

PRODUCTION: Includes total live weight of livestock marketed, farm slaughter and custom slaughter consumed on farms where produced, minus live weight of inshipments, with an adjustment for any increase or decrease in live weight of inventory.

PRICE: State prices are as published in the February AGRICULTURAL PRICES report, and are computed by weighting monthly estimated prices received by farmers, by monthly quantities sold.

CASH RECEIPTS: Receipts from marketings and any sale of farm slaughtered meats. Includes allowance for feeder pig outshipments.

VALUE OF HOME CONSUMPTION: Total value of slaughter on the farm and custom slaughter consumed on farms where produced.

GROSS INCOME: Sum of cash receipts and value of home consumption.

MEAT ANIMALS

Production, Disposition and Income
1987-1988

Total marketings of meat animals increased 2 percent during 1988 as decreased cattle marketings were offset by larger hog and sheep marketings. With higher prices received for cattle and lower prices for hogs and sheep, the resulting total cash receipts was \$46.0 billion, up 4 percent from 1987, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board.

The percentage breakdown of contributions to total U.S. cash receipts from marketings of meat animals by species in 1988 were: cattle and calves, 79 percent; hogs and pigs, 20 percent; sheep and lambs, 1 percent. U.S. prices received for cattle, hogs and sheep were published in AGRICULTURAL PRICES, released February 28, 1989.

Production of meat animals during 1988 totaled 63.2 billion pounds, up 3 percent from the 1987 production of 61.5 billion pounds. The value of meat animal production was \$37.0 billion in 1988 compared with \$35.6 billion in 1987.

CATTLE AND CALVES: Cash receipts from marketings of cattle and calves increased during 1988, as higher prices more than offset a decrease in marketings. For 1988, cash receipts from the sale of cattle and calves totaled \$36.3 billion compared with \$33.4 billion in 1987.

All cattle and calf marketings during 1988 totaled 53.9 billion pounds down 1 percent from the 54.4 billion pounds in 1987. The U.S. annual average price for cattle at \$66.60 per 100 pounds live weight was up 9 percent from 1987. The calf price for 1988, at \$89.20, was up 14 percent.

HOGS AND PIGS: Cash receipts for hogs and pigs were \$9.2 billion during 1988, 10 percent below 1987. Marketings of 21.6 billion pounds during 1988 were 9 percent above 1987, while the U.S. annual average price per 100 pounds of live weight decreased 17 percent from \$51.20 in 1987 to \$42.30 in 1988.

SHEEP AND LAMBS: Cash receipts from marketings of sheep and lambs in 1988 totaled \$473 million, down 13 percent from 1987. The average price of sheep in 1988 was \$25.60 per 100 pounds of live weight, down from \$29.50 in 1987. Lamb prices decreased from \$77.60 in 1987 to \$69.10 in 1988.
