Sales are still strong with the gift pack and candy trade businesses while the commercial buyers are just now starting to make a move. Very little mention for exporting to Asia at this time which is interesting since the season started late and growers are expecting a short harvest time this year and less volume available.

More offerings will be available as Moneymakers, Schley, Desirables and other Improved varieties are getting ready to hit the markets.
