PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

The weather for this week shows rather mild temps in the 70s and low 80s and evenings in the mid-50s to high 60s. Rain is possible on Monday, October 25, 2021. Many offerings went under contract this week as commercial buyers are waiting until the prices settle and the gift pack and candy makers slow down with purchases early in this late season. Prices have dropped slightly after a strong early start. Export buyers for China and Asia are watching and waiting for prices to settle as well before making offers.

More offerings will be available later in the week as some Moneymakers, Oconee, Schley, Caddo and Desirables are getting sorted and weighed now. Some are already under contract and affecting offerings to the open markets. So much rain and then high temps during the late summer has created some issues in areas that were not expected. Some orchards are not fully developed leaving total volume down and then some areas have had more scab issues due to weather conditions. Prices for good export quality pecans are expected to remain fairly high unless more volume appears by magic soon.

Weather for this week calls for mild temperatures and possible rain on Monday, October 25, 2021. This year's crop will be very light again as the weather has not been good for the pecans. Too much rain, scab and black rot along with very little crop to work with has most commercial buyers looking elsewhere to fill orders.
