PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

The weather for this week is mild with temps mostly sunny with days in the high 70s to low 80s and cool evenings in the 50s and low 60s. Perfect weather for gathering pecans and getting them sorted and sacked. Prices remain steady and strong for this early in the season. The crop is late and some growers are experiencing less volume than expected or hoped for creating a little breathing room for them to work with while negotiating on price. It also makes it more difficult to put together full loads of the same varieties.

More offerings will be available later this week while some Creek and Schley are under contract and Pawnee is still the main variety coming in. Caddo and Van Deman were offered but had too few sales to establish market prices. Buyers that need pecans right now are paying good prices as well as the gift pack and candy maker businesses. No mention of any sales for export to Asia yet. Door prices are just getting established with a few Elliott, Excel and Van Deman among others being offered. It is a very slow start for the season.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Thursday, October 14, 2021 thru late afternoon Tuesday, October 19, 2021) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
