PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Weather forecast for the next ten days in the Southern and Central parts of the state show mild temps with evening lows in the 40s and daytime highs in the 60s with slightly cooler temps for the Northern areas. Rain is expected for Friday, January fourth. Flash floods in effect from previously heavy rains earlier in the week and from the holiday break. Some accumulators and shellers have closed for the season.

Growers with premium quality pecans have put them into cold storage while waiting for prices to rebound. Door and yard tree offerings are very light and most domestic buyers are closed for the season.

Blends with (nut count 50-65) and 42.5-50% meat yields sold in a range of about \$2.84-3.29 mostly \$2.90-3.05 per point. Blends with 35-39% meat yields sold in a range of about \$1.80-2.05, 30-33% meat yields \$1.50-1.60 per point. B grade lots with 25-35% meat yields \$1.00-1.10 per point.

Buying interest for the export business is slow as well as the retail and domestic trade as some buyers are purchasing from other areas to fill orders. Offerings of Improved varieties and Native Seedlings are insufficient to establish market prices.

LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Plenty of rain over the last two weeks during the holiday break.

Offerings are very light and growers are searching for a market for their remaining pecans that are still available. Some offerings have been turned away due to excess moisture, sprouting and black rot.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon December 18, 2018 thru late afternoon January 3, 2019) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

WESTERN REGION

ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were fairly light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvesting is expected to increase during the next two weeks. Harvested quality has been variable. Prices on pecans were generally unchanged.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the low 20s to low 40s with highs in the mid-40s to low 60s. On Sunday, January 6, there is a 0-60 percent chance of precipitation.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly active for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was moderate for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were moderate. Many growers are deferring making marketing decisions, opting instead to concentrate on harvesting and storing nuts for later sale.

TEXAS Central, South, Eastern Areas, (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points were light. Demand was fairly good for good quality pecans. Harvesting is expected to remain light. Natives are currently being harvested. Crop conditions have been variable. Prices were generally unchanged.

Demand was good for the retail and gift pack trade. Buyers are continuing to make purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans. The pecan season in Texas is starting to wind down, as some growers are finishing for the season.

The weather forecast for the coming week calls for low temperatures from the low 30s to low 60s, with high temperatures in the upper 30s to low 70s. There is 0-20 percent chance of precipitation from Thursday, January 3 through Sunday, January 6.

Prices paid to growers (from noon Tuesday, December 18, 2018 through noon Thursday, January 3, 2019) at buyers delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries light) machine harvested 80-100 mostly 80-90 occasional higher and lower; yard tree lots 60-80 mostly 60-70 occasional higher and lower
