International Trade Highlights:

The USDA Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) trade data used to populate the sections for U.S. red meat, poultry and egg exports and imports is not available.

North America:

According to data from the USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), as reported by the USDA Livestock, Poultry and Grain Market News (LPGMN), during 2018, U.S. imports of feeder cattle from Canada totaled 194,064 head. This was 65.4 percent higher than the previous year. Imports of slaughter steers, heifers and cows from Canada equaled 382,844 head, which was 17.5 percent lower than a year ago. During 2018, slaughter bull imports were 13.6 percent less than 2017, totaling 44,677 head. Imports of feeder pigs from Canada during 2018 equaled 4,303,114 head, which fell 6.7 percent from a year ago. Slaughter hog imports were down 6.3 percent from the previous year, totaling 792,451 head. According to data from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, as reported by LPGMN, during 2018, the U.S. imported 7.0 million pounds of processed eggs, which was 1.2 percent greater than a year ago. More specifically, liquid processed eggs imports from Canada during 2018 increased 16.0 percent over 2017, totaling 4.7 million pounds. Frozen processed egg imports during 2018 were 26.8 percent less than the previous year, amounting to 2.1 million pounds. U.S. dried processed egg imports equaled 248,000 pounds, which was 504.9 percent above the period a year ago. Additionally, according to recent data from USDA LPGMN, during 2018, the U.S. imported 1,255,184 head of feeder cattle from Mexico. Pacific Rim:

Recently, the Thailand's Thai Customs Department published Thailand's poultry export data for November 2018. According to the data, during November, Thailand exported 2,254 MT of poultry meat. This was 8.0 percent less than the previous month but was 2.3 percent more than the same period a year ago. More specifically, exports of other poultry meat totaled 1,802 MT, which was down 13.1 percent from October but was relatively unchanged from November 2017. This comprised of 83.5 percent of total poultry meat. Exports of frozen poultry meat totaled 403 MT, which was 21.9 percent higher than the previous month and was 10.4 percent higher than a year ago. Exports of fresh and chilled poultry meat was up 13.5 percent over the previous month, totaling 48 MT. Also, this rose 25.0 percent over November 2017. During November, Thailand's poultry meat exports to Japan were 1.1 percent higher than October but were 5.9 percent lower than November 2017, totaling 1,121 MT. Year-to-date export totals to Japan was 11.9 percent greater than the same period a year ago, equaling 13,290 MT. Japan was the largest export market for Thailand poultry meat, comprising of 51.2 percent of the total. Thailand's poultry meat exports to Laos equaled 54 MT during November. This was 63.6 percent less than the previous month and was 88.4 percent less than a year ago. Total year-to-date exports to Laos reached 3,368 MT, down 7.6 percent from a year ago. During November, poultry meat exports to Malaysia totaled 215 MT, which was 14.8 percent less than the previous month. Also, this was 15.1 percent lower than last year. Year-to-date export totals to Malaysia equaled 3,134 MT, up 25.8 percent over a year ago. Overall, year-to-date poultry exports from Thailand were 23.9 percent above the corresponding period a year ago, totaling 25,944 MT. Japan's Agriculture and Livestock Industries Corporation (ALIC) recently released Japan's beef and pork import statistics for November 2018. According to the data, during November, Japan imported 51,685 MT of beef, which was up a little over October and was up 24.4 percent over November 2017. More specifically, frozen beef imports equaled 26,773 MT, which was 3.4 percent lower than the previous month but was 37.0 percent higher than November 2017. Fresh, chilled beef imports equaled 24,852 MT, which was 5.1 percent higher than the previous month and was 13.2 percent higher than November 2017. During November, Japan's beef imports from Australia rose 7.1 percent over the previous month and rose 26.4 percent over November 2017 to 26,962 MT. Year-to-date beef imports from Australia totaled 286,724 MT, which was 9.3 percent more than last year. Australia was the main source for Japan's beef imports with 51.2 percent of the total. Beef imports from the U.S. during November equaled

21,361 MT. Although this was slightly lower than the previous month, it was 20.6 percent higher than a year ago. Total year-to-date beef imports from the U.S. were 3.1 percent higher than a year ago, amounting to 227,528 MT. Beef imports from New Zealand during November fell 20.1 percent from the previous month to 1,069 MT. However, this was 26.5 percent more than November 2017. Total year-to-date beef imports from New Zealand equaled 13,136 MT, 11.7 percent less than a year ago. Overall, Japan's total year-to-date beef imports were 6.4 percent above the same period a year ago, amounting to 559,863 MT. Japan's beef marketings during November totaled 83,108 MT, which was 4.7 percent more than the previous month and was 10.6 percent more than a year ago. Marketings of imported beef equaled 50,085 MT, 16.7 percent higher than last year. Marketings of domestic beef were up 2.6 percent over a year ago, amounting to 33,023 MT. At the end of November, Japan's beef stocks totaled 125,754 MT, which was up 2.0 percent over the previous month and was up 7.0 percent over a year ago. Stocks of imported beef equaled 115,269 MT, which was 7.6 percent higher than a year ago. Stocks of domestic beef were 1.5 percent more than last year, amounting to 10,485 MT.

MT. Pork imports from Denmark during November equaled 8,459 MT, which was 17.1 percent less than the previous month and was 9.1 percent less than November 2017. Year-to-date pork imports from Denmark totaled 100,325 MT, 5.0 percent below last year. Overall, Japan's total year-to-date pork imports equaled 851,004 MT, which was a little more than the corresponding period a year ago. Japan's pork marketings during November equaled 168,018 MT. This was relatively unchanged from the previous month but was up 3.0 percent over a year ago. Imported pork marketings were 3.3 percent higher than a year ago, amounting to 86,093 MT. Domestic pork marketings totaled 81,925 MT, which was 2.8 percent more than last year. At the end of November, Japan's pork stocks equaled 163,417 MT, which was down 1.5 percent from the previous month and was down 3.7 percent from a year ago. Stocks of imported pork totaled 144,982 MT, 5.9 percent less than last year. Domestic pork stocks equaled 18,435 MT, 18.0 percent higher than last year.

Japan's pork imports during November totaled 83,346 MT, which was lightly less than the previous month and was 2.2 percent less than November 2017. Specifically, frozen pork imports equaled 43,464 MT, which was 9.9 percent lower than the previous month and was 2.7 percent lower than November 2017. Fresh, chilled pork imports equaled 39,880 MT, which was 11.6 percent higher than the previous month but was 1.6 percent lower than November 2017. During November, Japan's pork imports from the U.S. rose 16.8 percent over October but fell 2.9 percent from November 2017 to 25,616 MT. Year-to-date pork imports from the U.S. totaled 240,925 MT, which decreased 1.1 percent from a year ago. The U.S. was the primary source for Japan's pork imports with 28.3 percent of the total. During November, Japan imported 20,648 MT of pork from Canada. This was up slightly over the previous month but was down 3.0 percent from November 2017. Year-to-date pork imports from Canada were 3.1 percent higher than a year ago, amounting to 201,481

Japan's poultry imports during November totaled 43,179 MT. This was 20.6 percent less than October and was 24.3 percent less than November 2017. During November, Japan's poultry imports from Brazil equaled 30,840 MT, which was 21.1 percent lower than the previous month and was 27.2 percent lower than last year. Total year-to-date poultry imports from Brazil were down 4.6 percent from a year ago, amounting to 366,309 MT. Brazil was Japan's main source for poultry imports with 71.4 percent of the total. Poultry imports from Thailand during November fell 20.8 percent from the previous month to 10,559 MT. Also, this was 10.6 percent lower than November 2017. Total year-to-date beef imports from Thailand were 11.7 percent more than a year ago, amounting to 129,137 MT. Thailand was Japan's second leading poultry import market with 25.2 percent of the total. During November, Japan imported 1,441 MT of poultry from the U.S. This was 22.6 percent less than the previous month and was 39.5 percent less than November 2017. Year-to-date poultry imports from the U.S. totaled 15,668 MT, which fell 18.2 percent from last year. Overall, Japan's total poultry imports equaled 513,340 MT which was 1.8 percent below the same period a year ago. During November, Japan's poultry marketings equaled 169,958 MT. This was down 5.1 percent from the previous month and was down 9.0 percent from a year ago. Marketings of imported poultry were 14.6 percent less than a year ago, amounting to 43,248 MT. Domestic poultry marketings totaled 126,710 MT, 6.9 percent lower than last year. Japan's poultry stocks at the end of November totaled 166,174 MT. This was a little lower than the previous month and was 6.8 percent lower than a year ago. Stocks of imported poultry totaled 137,763 MT, 8.7 percent less than last year. Domestic poultry stocks were up 4.1 percent over a year ago, amounting to 28,411 MT.



Japan's total egg product imports during November totaled 1,861 MT, which was 6.2 percent lower than the previous month and was 21.2 percent lower than November 2017. More specifically, during November, powdered egg albumen imports totaled 681 MT, which was nearly 1.0 percent less than October and was 25.4 percent less than November 2017. Total year-to-date powdered egg albumen imports were 4.0 percent more than the corresponding period a year ago, totaling 8,953 MT. This comprised of 40.0 percent of the total egg product imports for Japan. During November, other egg yolk imports totaled 444 MT, which was up 47.7 percent over the previous month but was down 20.6 percent from November 2017. Year-to-date other egg yolks equaled 4,297 MT, 19.5 percent less than the corresponding period a year ago. This accounted for 19.2 percent of the total egg products imports for Japan. Liquid egg imports decreased 13.3 percent from the previous month but increased 5.3 percent over November 2017, amounting to 338 MT. Year-to-date liquid egg imports equaled 3,814 MT, which was 19.7 percent higher than a year ago, and comprised of 17.1 percent of total egg product imports. Powdered egg yolk imports during November were 60.5 percent below last year, totaling 152 MT. Also, this was 31.5 percent lower than the previous year. Total year-to-date powdered egg yolk imports equaled 2,660 MT, 8.3 percent more than the same period a year ago. This represented 11.9 percent of the total egg products imports for Japan. Finally, powdered whole egg imports during November were 11.7 percent higher than October but were 29.2 percent lower than a year ago, equaling 246 MT. Powdered whole egg total year-to-date imports were 15.7 percent more than the previous year, amounting to 2,639 MT, and accounted for 11.8 percent of the total egg product imports. Overall, Japan's total year-to-date egg product imports equaled 22,361 MT, 2.3 percent above the corresponding period a year ago. The Korea International Trade Association (KITA) recently released South Korea's beef, pork and poultry meat and edible offal import data for December 2018. According to the numbers, South Korea's beef imports during December totaled 18,930 MT. This was 37.0 percent lower than the previous month and was 5.7 percent lower than December 2017. More specifically, frozen beef imports equaled 12,947 MT, which accounted for 68.4 percent of the total. Fresh, chilled beef imports equaled 5,443 MT, of which the U.S.'s share was 64.0 percent. During December, South Korea's beef imports from the U.S. totaled 10,617 MT, which was down 41.2 percent from the previous month and was down 3.6 percent from December 2017. During 2018, South Korea imported 210,613 MT of beef from the U.S., which was 18.7 percent more than a year ago. The U.S. was South Korea's main source for beef imports with 50.7 percent of the total. Imports of beef from Australia during December totaled 5,797 MT. This was 40.1 percent less than the previous month and was 17.4 percent less than December 2017. During 2018, South Korea's beef imports from Australia were 2.0 percent higher than last year, amounting to 176,075 MT. Australia was South Korea's second largest beef import market with 42.4 percent of the total. During December, South Korea imported 1,269 MT of beef from New Zealand. This was down 12.9 percent from the previous month and was down 9.9 percent from December 2017. Year-to-date beef imports from New Zealand equaled 19,696 MT, 4.9 percent more than last year. Overall, South Korea's total beef imports during 2018 equaled 415,478 MT, 9.6 percent greater than the same period a year ago. Meanwhile, during December, South Korea imported 46,233 MT of pork, which was down 5.6 percent from November but was up 15.4 percent over December 2017. South Korea's pork imports from the U.S. during December rose 1.3 percent over the previous month to 16,736 MT. Also, this was 22.8 percent higher than December 2017. Total year-to-date pork imports from the U.S. equaled 196,385 MT, 28.4 percent more than a year ago. The U.S. was the primary supplier of pork to South Korea with 34.4 percent of the total imports. During December, pork imports from Germany equaled 11,043 MT. This was up 3.9 percent over the previous month and was up 24.7 percent over December 2017. During 2018, South Korea imported 117,689 MT of pork from Germany, which was 6.6 percent higher last year. South Korea's pork imports from Spain during December fell 23.5 percent from the previous month but rose 26.6 percent over December 2017 to 6,342 MT. Total year-to-date pork imports from Spain equaled 76,322 MT, 25.3 percent more than last year. Overall, during all four quarters of 2018, South Korea imported 571,193 MT of pork, which was 16.7 percent higher than the corresponding period a year ago. Meanwhile, during December, South Korea imported 10,686 MT of poultry meat and edible offals. This was 6.9 percent lower than the previous month but was 7.8 percent higher than December 2017. During December, poultry meat and edible offal imports from Brazil were down 5.8 percent from November but were up 11.1 percent over last year, totaling 8,753 MT. Total year-to-date poultry meat and edible offal imports from Brazil were 25.7 percent more than last year, equaling 108,485 MT. Brazil was the primary supplier of poultry meat and edible offal to South Korea with 81.0 percent of the total. South Korea's poultry meat and edible offal imports from the U.S. during December totaled 139 MT. This was 33.2 percent lower than last month and was 87.7 percent lower than December 2017. Year-to-date poultry meat and edible offal imports from the U.S. were 20.2 percent less than last year, amounting to 9,873 MT. During December, South Korea imported 436 MT of poultry meat and edible offals from Denmark, which was 31.9 percent less than the previous month. Also, this was down 32.1 percent from December 2017. During all four quarters of 2018, South Korea's poultry meat and edible offals from Denmark totaled 5,465 MT, 2.2 percent more than a year ago. Overall, South Korea's total year-to-date poultry meat and edible offal imports equaled 133,945 MT, which was 24.9 percent above the corresponding period a year ago. Recently, Argentina's National Service of Health, Food and Agriculture Quality (SENASA) published Argentina's second quarter beef and poultry export data. The numbers include fresh beef and poultry, offals, processed beef, Hilton cuts, and poultry meat by-products. According to the data, during the second quarter of 2018, Argentina exported 95,940 MT of beef. This was 6.5 percent lower than the previous quarter but was 41.3 percent higher than a year ago. During the second quarter, Argentina's beef exports to China rose 9.4 percent over the previous quarter to 35,470 MT. Also, this was 85.0 percent higher than the second quarter a year ago. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's beef exports to China equaled 67,894 MT, which was 91.3 percent more than a year ago. China was the main beef export market for Argentina with 34.2 percent of the total. During the second quarter, Argentina's beef exports to Russia fell 4.9 percent from the previous quarter but rose 61.6 percent over the same quarter last year, totaling 18,581 MT. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's beef exports to Russia equaled 38,121 MT, which was 76.8 percent more than last year. Russia was the second largest beef export market for Argentina with 19.2 percent of the total. During the second quarter, Argentina exported 9,530 MT of beef to Hong Kong. This was down 28.3 percent from the previous quarter but was up 28.0 percent over the same quarter a year ago. Total year-to-date beef exports to Hong Kong were 25.4 percent above last year, amounting to 22,827 MT. Beef exports to Chile during the second quarter totaled 5,607 MT. This was 14.7 percent lower than the previous quarter and 20.6 percent lower than the same quarter a year ago. Total year-to-date beef exports to Chile were 9.5 percent less than a year ago, amounting to 12,179 MT. Beef exports to Israel during the second quarter totaled 3,247 MT, which was 58.5 percent lower than the previous quarter but was 8.5 percent higher than the previous quarter a year ago. Year-to-date beef exports to Israel equaled 11,076 MT, which was 28.2 percent more than last year. During the second quarter, Argentina exported 4,885 MT of beef to Germany. This was 9.1 percent lower than the previous quarter but was 19.2 percent higher than the same quarter a year ago. During the first half of the year, Argentina's beef exports to Germany totaled 10,260 MT, which was 22.7 percent greater than a year ago. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's beef exports to Thailand totaled 5,245 MT, which was 7.1 percent more than the same period a year ago. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's main beef export market for Hilton cuts was Germany with 57.9 percent of the total. The largest fresh beef export market was China with 55.6 percent. The largest processed beef export market, with 32.1 percent of the total, was Paraguay. The primary offal market was Russia with 34.7 percent of the total. Of Argentina's total beef exports during the first half of 2018, 61.5 percent consisted of fresh beef, 31.5 percent was offals, 6.8 percent was Hilton cuts and less than 1.0 percent was processed beef. Overall, Argentina's total beef exports during the first half of 2018 equaled 198,498 MT, which was 45.0 percent above the corresponding period a year ago.

Meanwhile, during the second quarter of 2018, Argentina exported 36,276 MT of poultry. This was 14.3 percent lower than the previous quarter and was 19.0 percent lower than a year ago. During the second quarter, Argentina's poultry exports to China rose slightly over the previous quarter to 12,431 MT. Also, this was 7.6 percent higher than a year ago. During this first half of 2018, Argentina's poultry exports to China equaled 24,762 MT, which was 4.2 percent more than the corresponding period a year ago. China was the main poultry export market for Argentina with 31.5 percent of the total. During the second quarter, Argentina's poultry exports to South Africa were down 46.8 percent from the previous quarter and were down 9.5 percent from the same quarter a year ago, amounting to 4,800 MT. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's poultry exports to South Africa reached 13,828 MT, up 36.9 percent over the same period a year ago. South Africa was the second largest poultry export market for Argentina with 17.6 percent of the total. During the second quarter, Argentina exported 2,380 MT of poultry to Chile. This was 20.1 percent lower than the previous quarter and was 31.1 percent lower than the same quarter a year ago. Total year-to-date poultry exports to Chile fell 22.5 percent from the same period a year ago, amounting to 5,357 MT. Poultry exports to Hong Kong during the second quarter totaled 1,733 MT, 6.9 percent less than the previous quarter and 6.7 percent less than the same quarter a year ago. Year-to-date poultry exports to Hong Kong totaled 3,594 MT, which was 4.4 percent higher than last year. Poultry exports to Saudi Arabia during the second quarter totaled 2,647 MT. This was 265.1 percent higher than the previous quarter but has no comparison to the corresponding quarter a year ago. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's poultry exports to Saudi Arabia were significantly higher than the same period in 2017, equaling 3,372 MT. During the second quarter of 2018, poultry exports to Angola totaled 1,550 MT, 25.7 percent more than the previous quarter and 58.6 percent more than the corresponding quarter a year ago. During the first half of 2018, Argentina's poultry exports to Angola were down 12.0 percent from the same period a year ago, amounting to 2,783 MT. During the second quarter of 2018, Argentina's poultry exports to Singapore equaled 1,410 MT, which was 66.3 percent higher than the previous quarter and was 79.2 percent higher than a year ago. Total year-to-date poultry exports to Singapore increased 69.3 percent over the same period a year ago, at 2,258 MT. During the second quarter of 2018, Argentina's main poultry market for fresh meats was South Africa with 23.1 percent of the total. The primary by-products export market was China with 72.9 percent of the total. During the second quarter of 2018, fresh meats comprised of 58.4 percent and by products comprised of 41.6 percent of Argentina's total poultry exports. Overall, Argentina's total poultry exports during the first half of 2018 equaled 78,615 MT, which was 9.2 percent below the corresponding period a year ago.
