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CHICKENS AND EGGS: FARM PRODUCTION, DISPOSITION, CASH RECEIPTS AND GROSS
INCOME, 1940-44*

This report is one of a series on agricultural products presenting revised estimates for the years 1940 through 1944 of farm production, disposition, cash receipts and gross income. Estimates of numbers of chickens on farms January 1 and chickens raised are revised every 5 years after taking into consideration the changes indicated by Census enumerations and all other available data.

Inventory Numbers: Estimates of numbers of chickens on farms January 1 are based primarily upon the 5-year Census enumerations. These enumerations were first adjusted for changes between January 1 and the average date of enumeration in each State. These estimates cover only farm flocks as defined and enumerated by the United States Census. According to Census definition, a farm is a tract of land containing 3 acres or more, or producing agricultural products worth \$250 or more in the year enumerated. Estimates of change in numbers from year to year are based on rural carrier surveys made in December each year, covering about 150,000 livestock farms, and on changes in flocks belonging to about 25,000 crop reporters.

Non-Farm Flocks: No official estimates are prepared for non-farm flocks. The number of chickens in non-farm flocks is roughly assumed to be about 10 percent of those in farm flocks, and the production of chickens and eggs by non-farm flocks is in about the same proportion. By Geographic Regions, non-farm flocks are assumed to be the following percentages of farm flocks: North Atlantic 15 percent, East North Central 10 percent, West North Central 6 percent, South Atlantic 13 percent, South Central 11 percent, and the West 6 percent.

Commercial Flocks: Commercial flocks are presumed to be included in the Census totals by the Census definition of a farm. Separate estimates of commercial flocks have not been made since the type of management, rather than size, usually determines whether a flock is a farm flock or a commercial flock. Classifications by size of flock are available from the Census of 1940 but there is little information on type of management.

Chickens Raised: The estimates of numbers of chickens raised on farms are based partly upon numbers of chickens raised reported by the United States Census and in part upon other information. This other information includes the number of baby chicks produced by commercial hatcheries and the proportion of these bought for farm flocks, the relation of numbers of young chickens on hand in sample farm flocks on June 1 (plus prior disposals and later hatchings) to inventory numbers of older chickens on hand, and the probable total consumption of chickens by producers and by non-producers.

Chickens Produced on Farms: These estimates represent the number of chickens sold, plus the number consumed in farm households, plus or minus the change in inventory numbers during the year. They are the net annual farm production of chickens, equivalent to the number raised during the year, less death loss of chickens that were on hand at the beginning of the year. Young chickens of the current year's hatchings that die are not included in the number of chickens raised.

Commercial Broilers: The term commercial broilers as used here includes all young chickens of the heavy breeds, 2 to 4 pounds live weight under 18 weeks old, raised for meat and not as a by-product in the production of pullats for egg production. It does not include white leghorn broilers (sexed cockerels) which

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are raised incidental to the production of pullets for egg production. Commercial broiler production is not included in farm production estimates.

Death Loss of Layers: The annual death loss of chickens on hand at the beginning of the year is estimated from quarterly returns from crop reporters showing the number of layers per flock which died during the preceding month. The annual percentage death loss, computed from these quarterly returns, is applied to numbers of chickens on hand at the beginning of the year to get the total number which died during the year.

Farm Consumption of Chickens and Eggs: The annual farm consumption of chickens and eggs is also estimated from quarterly returns from crop reporters, showing the consumption in their households of chickens during the preceding month and of eggs during the preceding week. The basic estimates were the result of numerous studies of consumption per farm, multiplied by the number of farms on which chickens and eggs were consumed.

Egg Production Per Hen and Pullet on Farms January 1: The published rate of annual production per layer is computed by dividing the total annual production of eggs by the total number of hens and pullets on farms at the beginning of the year. This "hen house" rate is 25 to 35 percent less than the rate per average layer on hand during the year.

Eggs Produced: Annual egg production is the sum of the 12 monthly productions. Monthly egg production is estimated from returns from about 25,000 crop correspondents reporting on the first of each month for their own flocks the number of layers on hand and the eggs produced yesterday. Beginning with the estimated total number of layers on farms at the beginning of the year the change in numbers from month to month is estimated from the changes shown by reports from these sample farms. From the computed daily rate of lay per bird at the beginning and end of the month the monthly production per bird is derived. Total monthly egg production is obtained by multiplying the average number of layers by the monthly egg production per layer.

Revisions in the monthly average number of layers and total egg production are made at the end of the year if the change in number of layers shown by an annual survey with about 150,000 returns differs from the change in the number of layers estimated during the year from monthly returns.

Sales: Sales of chickens and eggs are computed by subtracting farm utilization from estimated production. These estimates of sales are checked so far as possible against the available data of commercial movement and of consumption off farms.

Prices: The value per head of chickens on hand January 1 is estimated from the values reported by crop reporters. The average annual prices per pound of chickens, live weight, and per dozen of eggs sold are computed from the monthly farm prices, weighted by the estimated quantities sold each month.

Income: Cash receipts from marketings of chickens are computed by multiplying the pounds of chickens sold by the average price per pound. Cash receipts from marketings of eggs are derived by multiplying the dozens of eggs sold by the price per dozen. Gross income from chickens is the total of cash receipts plus the value of chickens consumed in farm households. Gross income from eggs is the total of cash receipts plus the value of eggs consumed in farm households.

Gross income from commercial broilers is derived by multiplying the pounds produced by the price per pound. It includes consumption in households of broiler producers, which is less than 1 percent of the total production. Income from commercial broilers is not included in cash receipts from farm marketings or in gross farm income.
