CITRUS FRUITS

By States, 1961-62 and 1962-63 Production, Use and Value

This report presents statistics on production, farm disposition, price, value, and utilization of sales for the 1961-62 and 1962-63 crops of citrus fruits. The revised production and utilization estimates in this report are based on data available at the end of the marketing season such as marketing agreement records, recorded rail and truck movement, quantities inspected, and quantities used by processors. Estimated allowances are made for unrecorded local sales and quantities used in farm households. For the 1962-63 California crops of Valencia oranges, grapefruit, and lemons, the estimates are preliminary because records are not yet complete for the marketing season.

Citrus production for 1962-63 totaled 6.5 million tons, 25 percent below the record high of 8.6 million tons produced the year before. A severe winter freeze in Florida on December 13, 1962, was the major cause of the sharp reduction, although some freeze damage occurred in all citrus States during the winter months. Production in Texas and Louisiana was negligible as the result of the January 9-12, 1962 freeze which destroyed most of the citrus bearing surface in these two States.

The value of production was 422 million dollars, down 10 percent from that for the 1961-62 crop. The value estimates in this report cover the marketing season and should not be confused with cash receipts from these crops for a calendar year.

Of the 105 million boxes of oranges produced during the 1962-63 season, about 71 percent were grown in Florida, 28 percent in California, and 1 percent in Arizona. The year before, 82 percent of the oranges were produced in Florida, 15 percent in California, and 3 percent in Texas, Arizona, and Louisiana combined. The orange crop was 26 percent smaller than in 1961-62--Valencias were down 37 percent and early, midseason, Temple, and Navel oranges were down 14 percent. The U.S. production of grapefruit, which totaled 34.6 million boxes, was down 19 percent from the 1961-62 crop. Florida produced 87 percent of all grapefruit in the U.S. compared with 82 percent the year before.

Processors used 63 percent of the 1962-63 citrus crop compared with 64 percent of the 1961-62 crop. About 71 percent of the oranges, 52 percent of the grapefruit, and 27 percent of the lemons were processed compared with 72 percent of the orange, 45 percent of the grapefruit, and 46 percent of the lemons during the 1961-62 season. Approximately 63 percent of Florida's oranges were used for frozen concentrate--down slightly from the 65 percent used the year before.
