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Summary

Hogs and Pigs: Final Estimates by States, 2008-2012, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Statistics Board, National Agricultural Statistics Service, Statistical Bulletin No. 1035.

Introduction: This bulletin presents final estimates, including revisions made by the Agricultural Statistics Board (ASB), for the production years 2008 through 2012. Inventory, market hogs, breeding herd, and pig crops were published during calendar years 2008-2012 in periodic ASB reports. Data included in this publication provide a historic record and a benchmark for current estimates. Inventory values and value per head will be published in the Meat Animals, PDI - Final Estimates 2008-2012, Statistical Bulletin No. 1040.

Procedures: Revisions were made after a thorough review of the original survey data and all additional data now available, including the 2012 Census of Agriculture. Other data series considered included slaughter data, shipment records, imports, and exports. Inventory levels, pig crops, and their relationship to slaughter were compared to historic totals. The 2008-2012 estimates shown herein are considered final and will not be revised again. Revisions to United States estimates of December 1, 2008-2012 hogs and pigs inventories and 2008-2012 annual pig crops are included below.
