CELERY: Planting was virtually completed in the Everglades area of Florida but continued in the Central area. Crop condition was generally good in both areas. Cutting continued steady.

Celery transplanting continued in California's Central Coast area and Ventura County. Harvest was active in the South Coast area. A few acres were abandoned. Growing conditions have been normal.
