CELERY: Transplanting continues on schedule in Florida. Harvest is active with a good supply available from the Everglades and a lesser but steady supply from the Central area. Crop condition continued mostly good in the above normal temperatures.

Celery in the Central Coast area of California was virtually all harvested. Transplanting continued in the South Coast Counties. Growing conditions were generally normal. Rainfall was sporadic during December.
