Celery: Although New York's celery was 10 days behind normal, recent wet, warm weather has crop rapidly catching up. Crop quality ranges from good to very good. Cold spring weather in Michigan slowed planting slightly. Crop development is estimated to be 5 to 7 days behind normal due to lower than normal temperatures. Grower reported only minor damage from the May 24 to 27 freezes.

Harvest is declining seasonally in the Florida Everglades but is expected to continue through late June in the Central area. Yields during May were above the previous year. Quality is good with sizes peaking on $2-2\ 1/2$ dozen per crate.

California's Central Coast harvest started in early May with light volume. In the South Coast, harvest continued through May with moderate to fairly light supplies. Temperatures ranged 4 to 9 degrees above normal in both South and Central Coast Districts during May.
