

# cattle, sheep and goat inventory



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Number of Livestock Species Farms

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January 1, 1972 inventory estimates show an increase in cattle, but a decline in sheep from January 1, 1971. Cattle numbers climbed to a new high of 117.9 million head, 3 percent more than a year earlier. Sheep and lamb numbers continued the downtrend started in 1961, falling to 18.5 million head, 6 percent below a year earlier.

Total value of cattle and calves on farms and ranches January 1, 1972 was also a record high \$24.6 billion, 16 percent above a year earlier. The value per head averaged \$209, up \$24 from a year earlier. The sheep and lamb inventory was valued at \$423.5 million, down 9 percent from a year earlier. The value per head for sheep and lambs was down 80 cents to an average of \$22.90.

The index number for total livestock and poultry on farms was 107 (1967=100). This is 1 point more than a year earlier and compares with the 1970 index of 102. The index for meat animals was 107, up 1 point, while milk cattle and poultry each slipped 1 point to 90 and 99, respectively.

**CATTLE:** The January 1, 1972 inventory of all cattle and calves on U.S. farms and ranches set a new record high at 117,916,000 head--3 percent above the previous high of 114,470,000 head a year earlier. The revised January 1, 1971 estimate is 98,000 head below the preliminary estimate.

The following changes in the Livestock and Poultry Inventory report announced in October 1971 are effective with this report.

1. The name of the report is changed to "Cattle, Sheep and Goat Inventory, January 1".
2. Inventories of hogs and pigs, chickens, and turkeys are no longer included in this report. Numbers and values of hogs and pigs were published in the December 1971 issue of "Hogs and Pigs". The chicken inventory and value appeared in the January issue of "Eggs, Chickens and Turkeys". Turkey breeder hen inventory and value were published in the January issue of "Turkeys".
3. Estimates of the number of livestock species farms (cattle, milk cow, hog and sheep) will be a regular part of this report.
4. Value estimates of all cows and heifers that have calved have been discontinued. Value of stock sheep and lambs will be discontinued in 1973.
5. The estimates of rams 1 year old and older are combined with the estimates of wethers 1 year old and older beginning with January 1, 1972, except in Texas and Alaska.

Texas remains the Nation's leading cattle State with an inventory of 12,829,000, up 2 percent from a year earlier. Iowa maintained the No. 2 position with 7,773,000, up 5 percent. Nebraska moved up to third place with 6,780,000, an increase of 5 percent.

The inventory was down less than 1 percent (16,000 head) in the North Atlantic region but increased in all others. Numbers in the East North Central, South Atlantic, and Western regions each increased 2 percent; gains in the West North Central and South Central each totaled 4 percent.

All cows and heifers that have calved totaled 51,004,000 on January 1, 1972, a 2-percent gain over the 49,947,000 a year earlier. Beef cow numbers increased 3 percent to 38,725,000, but this was partly offset by a 1-percent decline in milk cows to 12,279,000 head. Beef replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, increased 6 percent to 6,840,000, while milk cow replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, were virtually unchanged at 3,942,000. Bulls, 500 pounds and over, advanced 3 percent to 2,365,000. Milk cows and milk replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, totaled 16,221,000 head, down 1 percent from a year earlier.

Other heifers, 500 pounds and over, totaled 6,331,000 head, a 5-percent gain from the 6,046,000 a year earlier. Included with the other heifers were 2,997,000 heifers weighing 500 pounds and over in feedlots in the 23 major cattle feeding States on January 1, 1972. Steers, 500 pounds and over, numbered 15,711,000, 2 percent above a year earlier. This total included 8,058,000 steers on feed as of January 1, 1972 in the 23 major cattle feeding States. The number of all heifers, steers, and bull calves under 500 pounds was up 4 percent to 31,723,000, with the number on feed in the 23 States on January 1, 1972 at 2,134,000.

Imports of cattle and calves, mostly from Canada and Mexico, totaled 990,709 in 1971, down 15 percent from the 1,167,662 head imported during 1970.

The value of cattle and calves on farms and ranches January 1, 1972 amounted to a record high \$24.6 billion, a 16-percent gain from a year earlier. The average value per head increased \$24 to \$209.

**SHEEP:** The number of all sheep and lambs, at 18,482,000 head, declined 6 percent during 1971, continuing the downtrend which began in 1961. Stock sheep numbers dropped 7 percent and totaled 15,767,000 on the first of this year. The 26 principal sheep feeding States had 2,715,000 sheep and lambs on feed for slaughter market, 3 percent more than a year earlier.

All classes of stock sheep showed declines from a year ago. Ewes 1 year old and older on January 1, 1972 totaled 12,854,000, down 6 percent from a year earlier. Rams and wethers 1 year old and older numbered 557,000, a drop of 8 percent. Ewe lambs under 1 year, at 1,954,000, and wether and ram lambs, at 402,000, were both down 14 percent.

The number of stock sheep and lambs on January 1, 1972 in the 35 Native States was 4,049,000, down 6 percent from a year earlier. The 11 Western States plus Texas and South Dakota had 11,699,000 stock sheep and lambs, 7 percent fewer than on January 1, 1971. All of the 13 Western States showed declines from the previous year.

On January 1, 1972 all sheep and lambs were valued at \$424 million, \$40 million less than last year and \$83 million below 2 years ago. Average value per head for all sheep and lambs was \$22.90, compared with \$23.70 last year and \$25.00 on January 1, 1970.

**GOATS:** The number of goats and kids on Texas farms and ranches on January 1, 1972 was 1,500,000 head, 27 percent below a year earlier and 42 percent below January 1, 1970. Total value of goats at \$93 million, was \$2.4 million less than on January 1, 1971 and \$9.7 million less than 2 years earlier. Average value per head was \$6.20, compared with \$5.70 a year earlier and \$7.40 on January 1, 1970.
