PRODUCTION

EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK: Combined production of evaporated whole milk and sweetened condensed whole milk (case goods) in June 1971 is estimated at 141.5 million pounds by the Crop Reporting Board. This was unchanged from a year earlier but 8 percent below June 1969. Production in the first six months this year totaled 678.3 million pounds, down 1 percent from the same period in 1970 and 13 percent below 1969.

DRY MILK: Production of spray and roller process nonfat dry milk in June was 177.8 million pounds, 5 percent more than a year earlier and 1 percent above June 1969. The January-June total was 860.3 million pounds, 5 percent above 1970 but the same as in 1969. Dry whole milk production in June is estimated at 8.4 million pounds, 16 percent above a year earlier and 8 percent above June 1969. Production in the first six months of 1971 was 46.1 million pounds, 21 percent above 1970 and an increase of 21 percent over the same period in 1969.

June dry buttermilk output totaled 5.9 million pounds--3 percent less than a year earlier and 9 percent below June 1969. The January-June total of 33.6 million pounds was 3 percent below 1970 and 13 percent less than the comparable months in 1969.

STOCKS, SHIPMENTS, PURCHASES AND PRICES

EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK: Manufacturers' combined stocks of evaporated and sweetened condensed whole milk (case goods) on June 30 totaled 133.8 million pounds--23 percent less than a year earlier and 14 percent less than at the close of June 1969.

Prices paid by condenseries to producers during June averaged \$4.56 per hundredweight for milk having an average milkfat content of 3.64 percent. This is equivalent to \$1.25 per pound of milkfat—no change from May but 5 cents above June 1970.

Condenseries reported 208.1 million pounds of whole milk purchased in June from about 18,000 producers. The average daily purchase per producer was 385 pounds compared with 342 pounds in June 1970.

June evaporated whole milk selling prices reported by manufacturers ranged from \$7.47 to \$9.10 per case of forty-eight $14\frac{1}{2}$ ounce cans. This compares with \$7.39 to \$8.77 the preceding month and \$6.95 to \$8.30 in June 1970.

DRY MILK: Manufacturers' stocks of nonfat dry milk for human consumption on June 30, 1971 totaled 157.1 million pounds--3 percent less than a year earlier, but 11 percent above two years earlier. Dry whole milk stocks were 9.0 million, 13 percent above a year earlier and 13 percent below the end of June 1969. Dry buttermilk inventory, at 6.4 million pounds, was 39 percent less than a year earlier and 16 percent less than two years earlier.

Shipments of spray and roller process nonfat dry milk for human food totaled 161.6 million pounds in June-up 33 percent from a year earlier and 28 percent above June 1969. Dry whole milk shipments were 6.6 million pounds-an increase of 20 percent from a year earlier and 24 percent above June 1969. June shipments of dry buttermilk totaled 4.6 million pounds, 7 percent below 1970, but 6 percent above the same month in 1969.

Selling prices of spray and roller process (combined) nonfat dry milk averaged 31.75 cents per pound in June, up 0.36 cent from May, 4.18 cents above a year earlier and 8.23 cents above June 1969. Prices for dry buttermilk (human food and animal feed combined) averaged 27.83 cents per pound, down 0.11 cent from the preceding month, but 2.66 cents above June 1970 and 4.81 cents above June 1969. Dry whole milk prices for all package and container sizes averaged 47.61 cents per pound, 0.22 cent less than a month earlier, but 1.96 cents above June 1970. Over five pound packages, at 46.33 cents per pound in June, were up 0.15 cent from May and 2.28 cents above a year earlier.
