SPECIAL REGULATIONS GOVERNING MANUFACTURERS, DEALERS,
BROKERS, AND COMMISSION MERCHANTS IN COLD
STORAGE BUTTER

In connection with the regulations recently issued governing licensees dealing in Cold Storage Butter certain maximum margins were indicated by the Food Administration. The maximum margins are now modified as follows;

- (a) 1¢ per pound on carlot sales.
- (b) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than a car lot amounting to 7,000 pounds or more.
- (c) 2¢ per pound on sales less than 7,000 pounds but amounting to 3,500 pounds or more.
- (d) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than 3,500 pounds but amounting to 700 pounds or more.
- (e) 3¢ per pound on sales less than 700 pounds but amounting to 100 pounds or more.
- (f) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than 100 pounds.

The same addition to selling margins as heretofore indicated may be made when the butter is stored by the licensee more than two full calendar months.

C H E E S E
SPECIAL REGULATIONS GOVERNING MANUFACTURERS, DEALERS,
BROKERS, AND COMMISSION MERCHANTS IN CHEESE.

In connection with the regulations governing licensees dealing in Cheese certain maximum margins were indicated by the Food Administration. These maximum margins are now modified as follows:

- (a) 3/4¢ per pound on car lot sales.
- (b) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than a car lot but amounting to 7,000 pounds or more.
- (c) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than 7,000 pounds but amounting to 4,000 pounds or more.
- (d) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than 4,000 pounds but amounting to 1,000 pounds or more.
- (e) 3¢ per pound on sales less than 1,000 pounds but amounting to 100 pounds or more.
- (f) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound on sales less than 100 pounds.

The same additions to selling margins as heretofore indicated may be made when the Cheese is stored by the licensee more than thirty days.
