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SUGAR MARKET HIGHLIGHTS

DELIVERIES

February - Sugar deliveries in February 1977 were 6.4 percent lower than in February 1976 according to preliminary data. January-February deliveries were just over 1 percent ahead of the same period in 1976.

INVENTORIES

Month-End Stocks - Sugar stocks held by primary distributors on February 26, 1977 were 3.8 million short tons raw value, up 3.8 percent from the end of last month and over 17 percent from the same time a year ago.

DOMESTIC PRODUCTION

Total sugar production for the mainland United States was just over three quarters of a million short tons raw value for January 1977, down 10 percent from the first month of 1976. Hawaiian sugar production for the first seven weeks of 1977 was 22,359 tons, down 1/3 from the five year average.

IMPORTS

Imported raw sugar receipts for January 1977 were just over 310,000 short tons, a $7\frac{1}{2}$ percent increase over 1976. Refined sugar imports for the same period were $12\frac{1}{2}$ percent ahead of 1976. The Philippines was the leading supplier of raw sugar to the United States with over 122,000 short tons, raw value. Guatemala was second with over 49,000. Eleven different countries sent raw sugar to the United States in January.

RAW SUGAR PRICES

<u>World</u> - Compared with January, volume on the New York Coffee and Sugar Exchange declined by 38 percent in February with a total amount of 74,811. The February average spot price was 8.56 cents per pound, up .19 from January. The high for the month was on the 2nd at 8.95 and the low on the 23rd at 7.97. The first two weeks of March showed an average of 8.67.

<u>Domestic</u> - Trading volume in February decreased by 34 percent from January with a total of 1,756. The domestic spot price for the month rose by .11 from January to 11.06. The high for the month was on the 2nd at 11.40 while the low came on the 23rd with 10.47. The average for the first two weeks of February was 11.41.

REFINED SUGAR PRICES

Wholesale - Prices were up all across the country in February. Refiners in the Northeast showed an increase of 1½ percent for February compared to January while those in the Southeast rose 1 percent. Cane and beet prices in the Chicago West region went up 5 percent, while those on the Pacific Coast increased nearly 4 percent.

<u>Retail</u> - The average U.S. retail price for a 5 pound bag of granulated sugar was 21.42 cents per pound, up .38 from last month.
