Summary

Mink: Final Estimates by State and United States, 2002-2006, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Statistics Board, National Agricultural Statistics Service, Statistical Bulletin No. SB-1029.

Introduction: This bulletin presents final estimates, including revisions made by the Agricultural Statistics Board (ASB), for the production years 2002 through 2006. Mink pelts produced by color class and number of farms were published in calendar years 2003-2007 in annual ASB reports. Data included in this publication provide a historic record and benchmark for current estimates.

Procedures: Revisions were made after a thorough review of the original survey data and all additional data now available, including the 2007 Census of Agriculture. The 2002-2006 estimates shown herein are considered final and will not be revised again. Revisions to pelts produced at the National level are as follows:

Agricultural Census Publications: The U. S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released several products from the 2007 Census of Agriculture on February 4, 2009. The Census is the leading source of statistics about the Nation's agricultural production and the only source of consistent, comparable data at the county, State, and national levels. The Census includes all places from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products, including government payments, were produced and sold, or normally would have been sold, during the census year. Census publications also include demographic items such as sex of operator, residence on or off the farm, days worked off farm, years present on farm, age group categories, race, and number of persons living in each household.
