

STOCKS of SOYBEANS in All Positions

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Carryover of old crop soybeans in all storage positions on September 1 totaled 90.6 million bushels, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This compares with 35.6 million bushels on hand a year earlier and 29.7 million bushels on hand September 1, 1965. Further historical comparisons for September 1 based on survey data are not available, since this series of estimates was initiated with the September 1, 1965 report.

The September 1 end-of-year stocks indicate a disappearance of 877 million bushels since September 1, 1966. Beginning supplies on September 1, 1966 were 967 million bushels (carryover of 36 million bushels plus 1966 production of 931 million bushels.) Recorded disappearance since September 1, 1966 totaled 860 million bushels, consisting of 552 million bushels crushed, approximately 260 million bushels exported, and 48 million for seed and feed.
