Carryover of old crop soybeans in all storage positions totaled 98 million bushels on September 1, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This is down sharply from the 230 million bushels of a year earlier. At 21 million bushels, farm stocks were down 49 percent from September 1, 1970, and off-farm stocks of 77 million bushels were down 59 percent. The Commodity Credit Corporation owned 2.5 million bushels of the soybeans in storage and had loans outstanding on an additional 9 million bushels.

September 1 end-of-crop-year stocks indicate a disappearance during the September-August period of 1,268 million bushels from a beginning supply of 1,366 million bushels. Disappearance during the same period a year earlier was 1,221 million bushels. Approximately 760 million bushels were processed for oil during the past marketing year, 435 million exported, and 50 million used for seed and feed. The July-August disappearance totaled 185 million bushels, 7 percent above the 174 million for the corresponding period a year ago.
