Red meat production continued upward in 1956 and reached a new all time peak of 28 billion pounds, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Total meat production (commercial plus farm slaughter) for the year was 4 percent more than the previous record of 26.9 billion pounds in 1955. Beef production in 1956 reached a new record of 14.5 billion pounds-exceeding the 1955 record by 7 percent. Veal production totaled 1,632 million pounds--3 percent more than in 1955. Mutton and lamb production totaled 741 million pounds--2 percent less than a year earlier. Pork production totaled 11.2 billion pounds which was 2 percent more than in 1955. Beef accounted or 51 percent of the total meat produced in 1956, while pork made up 40 percent. The seal accounted for 6 percent and lamb and mutton contributed 3 percent. Lard production in 1956 totaled 2.8 billion pounds, compared with 2.7 billion pounds in 1955.

The number of cattle slaughtered in 1956 was 4 percent above 1955. Cattle slaughter under Federal inspection was up 6 percent from a year earlier, whereas other commercial slaughter was only slightly higher and farm slaughter was up 3 percent. Calf slaughter in 1956 was up 1 percent. Slaughter of calves under Federal inspection was up 5 percent, while other commercial slaughter was down 4 percent, and farm slaughter declined less than 1 percent from a year earlier. The total number of sheep and lambs slaughtered in 1956 was 1 percent less than in 1955. The number slaughtered under Federal inspection declined 1 percent from a year earlier--other commercial slaughter was off 4 percent and farm slaughter was down 1 percent. Total heg slaughter in 1956 was 5 percent greater than in 1955. Slaughter in Federally inspected plants was up 7 percent, while slaughter in other commercial plants was (Continued over)

down 1 percent and farm slaughter declined 2 percent. Slaughter cattle averaged 15 pounds heavier and calves averaged 6 pounds heavier than a year earlier. The average live weight of hogs was 5 pounds less than the previous year and sheep and lambs averaged a pound lighter. Revised estimates of commercial slaughter for 1956 by States will be released May 8, 1957.
