

MARCH 1970 (10 Corn Belt States)

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HOGS AND PIGS ON FARMS DOWN 1 PERCENT

Hogs and pigs on farms in the 10 Corn Belt States on March 1, 1970 were down 1 percent from a year earlier, according to the Crop Reporting Board. An estimated 40.2 million were on farms March 1, 1970 compared with 40.5 million a year earlier. The 10 Corn Belt States are: Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, Nebraska and Kansas.

The December-February 1970 pig crop is estimated at 13.5 million, up 4 percent from the same period a year earlier. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 1,864,000 compared with 1,782,000 a year earlier.

Hog producers in the 10 States intend to farrow 7 percent more sows during March-May 1970 and 8 percent more during June-August 1970 than in the same periods a year earlier.

MARCH 1 INVENTORY

Ohio, Illinois, Minnesota and Kansas had more hogs and pigs on farms than a year earlier, but the larger numbers in these States did not offset the declines in the other six Corn Belt States. The estimate for Missouri is 4 percent below a year earlier, Iowa and Wisconsin 3 percent, each; South Dakota and Nebraska 2 percent, each; and Indiana 1 percent. Breeding stock was up 2 percent in the 10 States, and all States except Indiana, Wisconsin and Iowa show an increase.

Market hogs in the 10 States are estimated at 32,766,000 head, 1 percent less than a year earlier. All weight groups except the under 60 pound group are below last year. By weight groups, the estimated numbers and changes from a year earlier are as follows: Under 60 pounds, 12,625,000 head, up 342,000; 60-119 pounds, 7,105,000, down 64,000; 120-179 pounds, 7,683,000, down 455,000; 180-219 pounds, 4,422,000, down 230,000; and 220 pounds and over, 931,000, down 89,000.

DECEMBER-FEBRUARY PIG CROP

More sows farrowed during December-February in all 10 States except Missouri, which was unchanged from last year. The largest increases were in the Southwest Corn Belt States, where Nebraska was up 14 percent and Kansas, 17 percent. Illinois farrowings were 10 percent higher this year, and gains in the other six States ranged from 1 to 5 percent. The average number of pigs per litter for December-February was 7.22, compared with 7.23 pigs a year earlier.

MARCH-MAY FARROWING INTENTIONS

Hog producers in the 10 States intend to farrow 7 percent more sows in the March-May period than a year ago. Increases ranged from 2 percent in Wisconsin to 15 percent in Kansas. Missouri expects an increase of 10 percent; South Dakota and Nebraska, 9 percent each. Illinois intentions are up 8 percent. Iowa, the leading hog State, and Ohio and Minnesota expect 5 percent increases. If these intentions are realized, sows farrowing during the March-May period would account for about 44 percent of the March 1 breeding stock inventory. This is close to the normal relationships but 2 points above last year's percentage when severe weather, breeding problems and other factors caused actual farrowings to be well below intentions.

JUNE-AUGUST FARROWING INTENTIONS

First intentions estimated for the June-August quarter show an 8-percent increase compared with a year earlier; all States anticipate increases. By States, the increases range from 5 percent for Minnesota and Iowa to 15 percent in Nebraska. Intentions are up in: South Dakota, 13 percent; Illinois and Missouri, each 12 percent; Kansas, 10 percent; Ohio and Wisconsin, each 8 percent; and Indiana, 6 percent. Expected farrowings during this period are about 32 percent of the breeding stock on hand March 1. Although more than last year, this is in line with relationships for most earlier years.
