## NATIONAL SHEEP SUMMARY

Weekly Trends: Compared to last week slaughter lambs were steady to 10.00 lower with most decline on weights over 90 lbs. Slaughter ewes were steady to 10.00 higher. No good comparison on feeder lambs. At San Angelo, TX 3773 head sold. Equity Electronic Auction sold 240 slaughter ewes in Minnesota. In direct trading slaughter ewes and feeder lambs were not tested. 2500 head of negotiated sales of slaughter lambs were 2.00 lower. 2,531 lamb carcasses sold with all weights no trend due to confidentiality. All sheep sold per hundred weight (CWT) unless otherwise specified.

No allowance made for coring, freight or handling fees at the warehouse level to reflect net grower prices (\*) indicates new prices this week. Classed and skirted wools usually trade at a .10-.20 premium to original bag prices.

The Australian exchange rate was stronger by .0028 at .7151 percent of the U.S. dollar. Australian wool prices are quoted delivered Charleston, South Carolina. The current freight rate is .15 cents per pound clean. Schlumberger Dry formula is used for yield determination.

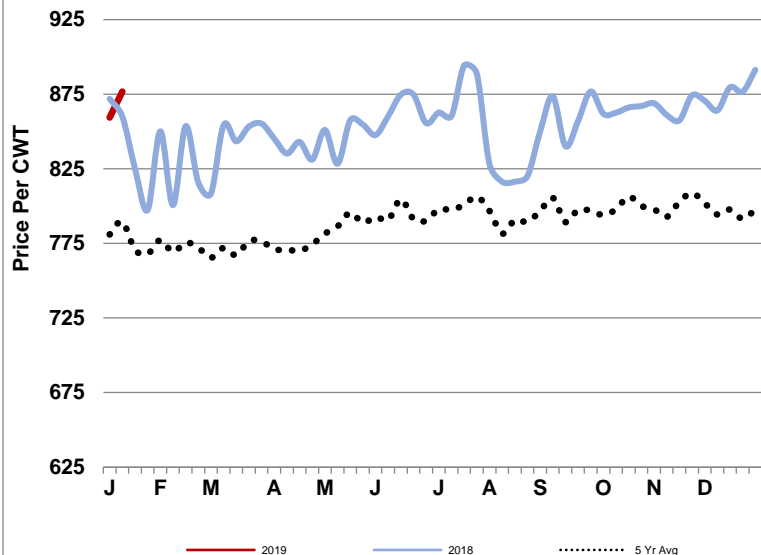

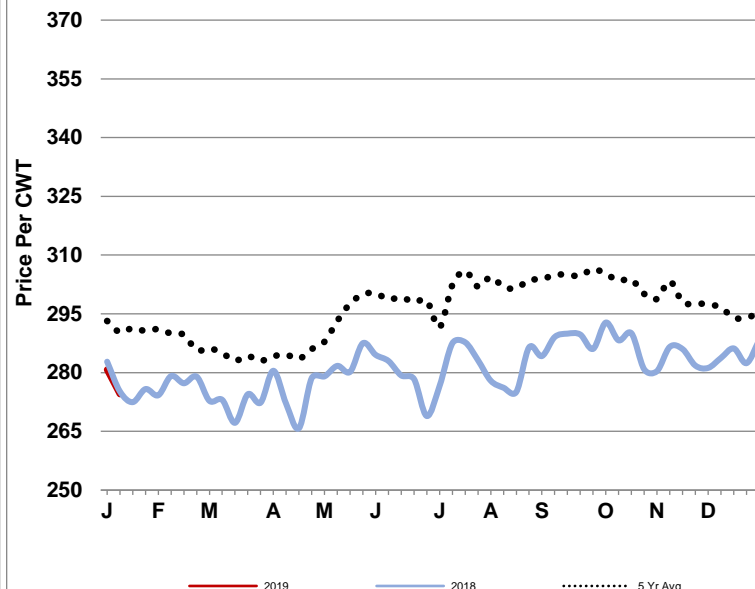

Australian exchange rate was stronger by .0028 at .7151 percent of the U.S. dollar.

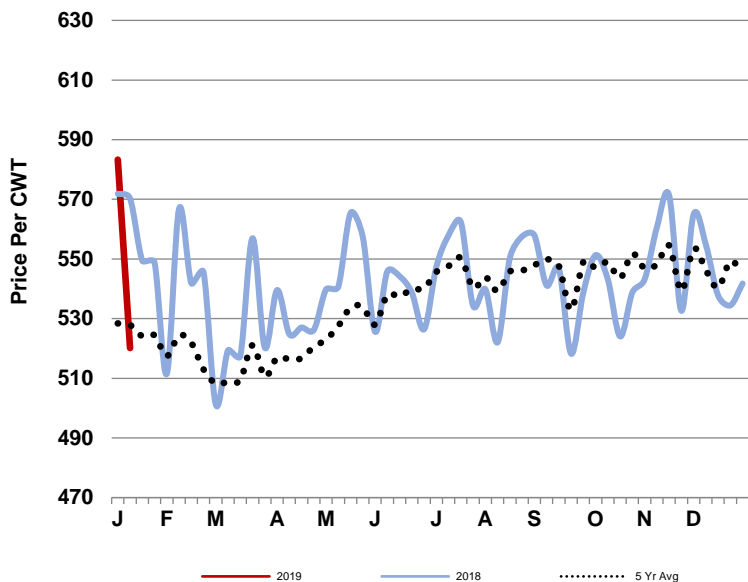
**Weekly Rack, 8-Rib, Medium**



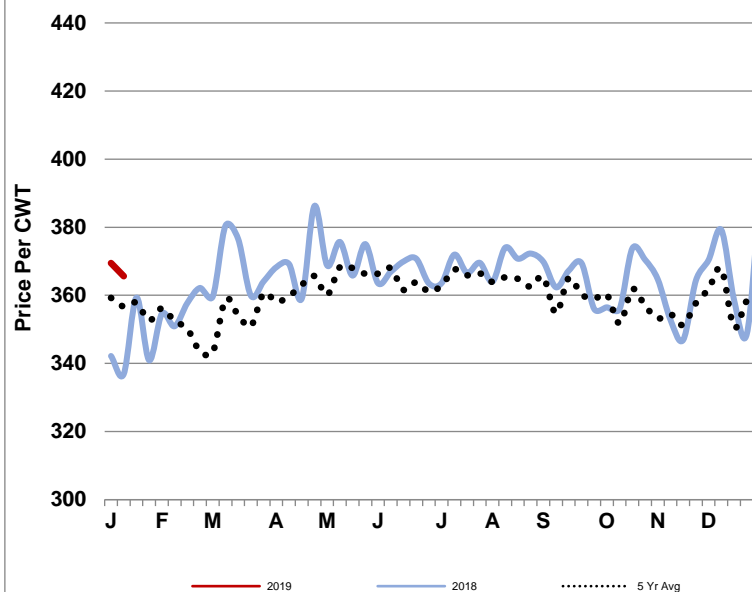
**Weekly Shoulders, Square-Cut**
