Slaughter ewes were weak to 15.00 lower, except at New Holland 10.00-15.00 higher. No good comparison on feeder lambs. At San Angelo, TX 8723 head sold. No sales in Equity Electronic Auction. In direct trading slaughter ewes and feeder lambs were not tested. 5600 head of negotiated sales of slaughter lambs were 5.00 higher. 3,942 lamb carcasses sold with all weights no trend due to confidentiality. NATIONAL WOOL REVIEW

Domestic wool trading on a clean basis was slow this week. There were 62,000 lbs of confirmed trades reported. Prices reflect trades FOB warehouse in original bag or square pack, bellies out, some graded, and 76 mm or longer. No allowance made for coring, freight or handling fees at the warehouse level to reflect net grower prices (*) indicates new prices this week. (NA) represents microns not normally available in this region. Wools shorter than 75 mm typically discounted .10-.20 clean. Classed and skirted wools usually trade at a .10-.20 premium to original bag prices.
