

SHIPMENTS OF STOCKER AND FEEDER CATTLE AND SHEEP

MAY 1968

Shipments into Selected North Central States

The number of stocker and feeder cattle and calves shipped into the 8 North Central States during May 1968 was 386 thousand head, down 5 percent from May 1967, according to the *Crop Reporting Board*. Of the total cattle and calves received in these 8 States during the month, 148 thousand head moved through public stockyards. This was a decrease of 7 percent from May 1967. The number of cattle and calves received direct in May 1968 was 239 thousand head, 3 percent fewer than a year earlier. Direct movement during May accounted for 62 percent of the total movement, compared with 61 percent a year earlier. Cattle and calves shipped into the 8 States during January-May 1968 amounted to 2.2 million head, 2 percent above the first five months of 1967.

May shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs into the 8 North Central States were 114 thousand head--up 20 percent from a year earlier. The 22 thousand head of sheep and lambs received through public stockyards during the month was 35 percent less than in May 1967, and the 92 thousand head received direct was 50 percent more than a year earlier. During January-May 1968, the number of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs shipped into the 8 States was 424 thousand head, up 7 percent from the 398 thousand during the same months of 1967.

Stocker and Feeder Cattle and Sheep from Public Stockyards

Inspected shipments of stocker and feeder cattle and calves from public stockyards during May 1968 were 350 thousand head, 9 percent less than the 385 thousand head shipped during May 1967.

Shipments of stocker and feeder sheep and lambs inspected at public stockyards in May 1968 totaled 39 thousand--down 2 percent from the 40 thousand head inspected a year earlier.
