

U.S. Sugar Monthly Import and Re-Exports

Fiscal Year (FY) 2022

November 2021

The November WASDE report shows FY 2022 WTO raw sugar tariff-rate quota (TRQ) shortfall projected at 250,764 short tons raw value (STRV), unchanged from last month. No information is available about specific countries.

The third tranche of the FY 2022 specialty sugar TRQ will open for 60,000 metric tons raw value on January 22, 2022. A valid specialty sugar certificate must accompany the imported sugar.
