Compared to last week: The special fed veal carcass market was steady to higher on comparable sales of non-packer owned calves as well as packer owned calves on light to moderate demand and light to moderate offerings. Harvest numbers were 10 percent higher compared to last week's total. Dressed weights were up 5.6 pounds in the Northeast, up 7.2 pounds in the North Central, with the total NE & NC being up 6 pounds.
