MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I Prices: The August price paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.78 per hundred-weight for about 155 markets -- up 4 cents from July. Prices generally increased 17 to 30 cents from July over most of Michigan, Ohio, western Pennsylvania, western West Virginia, southwestern Virginia, Kentucky, and Tennessee. Class I prices in most of Georgia increased 51 cents as a result of a 20-cent increase in the Georgia Federal Order price and a 31-cent negotiated premium. Most other markets were unchanged to 2 cents above July 1969 levels.

August Class I milk prices were 19 cents above a year earlier. Regional increases ranged from 3 cents for Mountain area markets to 25 cents for the East South Central markets.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 cities in early August averaged 54.7 cents per half-gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This was about the same as July 1969 and nearly 2 cents above August 1968.

Home-delivered prices: Half-gallon prices for home-delivered milk averaged slightly above a month earlier, but more than 2½ cents above a year earlier. The home-delivered prices represent list prices before deduction for quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary June sales: Preliminary data on total sales of fluid dairy products during June 1969 for nearly 70 marketing areas averaged about the same as a year earlier.

May sales: Total sales of fluid products for May in regulated markets averaged about 1 percent above a year earlier.

Whole milk sales during May were down 2 percent from May 1968. Cumulative sales for the first 5 months of 1969 were also 2 percent below a year earlier.

Low-fat and skim milk sales in May were up 12 percent from a year earlier.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half-and-half) averaged 5 percent below May 1968.

Total sweet and sour cream sales combined for the 59 Federal and 8 State marketing areas for which comparable data are available were 5 percent below May 1968. Cumulative sales for the first 5 months of 1969 were about 8 percent below a year earlier for the cream items.

Milk receipts: June receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for about 65 marketing areas were up nearly 2 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down about 4 percent from June 1969.

Milk production: U. S. milk production during July was estimated at 10.2 billion pounds -- down less than 1 percent from a year earlier. July output provided 1.61 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.63 pounds a year earlier.
