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MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: Early June prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$7.84 per hundredweight for about 150 markets, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This was up 5 cents from May and 62 cents above a year earlier. Gains from a year earlier ranged from 49 cents in the Pacific region to 68 cents in the South Atlantic region.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 major cities in early June averaged 61.4 cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This was unchanged from May but 3.1 cents above June 1972.

Home-delivered prices: Home-delivered milk averaged 71.8 cents per half gallon in early June for 25 major cities. This was 0.5 cent above May and 3.5 cents above June 1972. Home-delivered prices represent list prices before quantity or other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Whole milk sales during March were up 1 percent from the 2.6 billion pounds of March 1972.

Low-fat and skim milk sales for March were up 10 percent from the year-earlier total of 864 million pounds.

Milk receipts: April receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 62 markets (60 Federal and 2 State) were down 2 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 4 percent from April 1972.

Milk production: May 1973 milk production was estimated at 11.1 billion pounds, 2 percent less than a year earlier. May output provided 1.70 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.66 pounds last month and 1.75 pounds in May a year ago.
