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## MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: Early July prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$7.11 per hundredweight for about 150 markets, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This was the same as June and 21 cents above a year earlier. All regional averages were above a year earlier, with increases ranging from 13 cents in the West South Central to 30 cents in the East North Central.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 major cities in early July averaged 57.9 cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This was down 0.1 cent from June but 0.5 cent above July 1970.

Home-delivered prices: Home-delivered milk averaged 67.3 cents per half gallon in July for 25 major cities. This was up 0.5 cent from June and 2.6 cents above July 1970. Home-delivered prices represent list prices before deduction for quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS  
OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary May sales: Preliminary May data on total sales of fluid dairy products in 63 marketing areas averaged about 1 percent above a year earlier.

April sales: Revised April sales of fluid products in 63 regulated markets (58 Federal 5 State ) averaged 1 percent above the 3.4 billion pounds a year earlier.

Whole milk sales during April were down over 1 percent from the 2.6 billion pounds in April 1970.

Low-fat and skim milk sales for April 1971 were up 10 percent from the year earlier total of 711 million pounds.

Milk and cream mixtures sales (mostly half and half) were nearly 7 percent below the 1970 level of 36 million pounds.

Milk receipts: May receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 64 markets (60 Federal and 4 State) were up nearly 4 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 1 percent from May 1970.

Milk production: June 1971 milk production for the United States was estimated at 10.84 billion pounds, 0.4 percent more than a year earlier. Output for June provided 1.74 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.75 pounds last month and 1.75 pounds in June 1970. Production during the first half of 1971 was 0.9 percent more than a year earlier.
