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MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: Early June prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$7.11 per hundredweight for about 150 markets, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This was 23 cents above a year earlier. Regional gains from a year earlier ranged from 13 cents in the West South Central Region to 31 cents in the East North Central Region.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 major cities in early June averaged 58.0 cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This is up 0.2 cent from early May and 0.9 cent above June 1970.

Home-delivered prices: Home-delivered milk averaged 66.8 cents per half gallon in June for 25 major cities. This was up 0.1 cent from May and 1.9 cents above June 1970. Home-delivered prices represent list prices before quantity or other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS
OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary April sales: Preliminary April data on total sales of fluid dairy products in 63 marketing areas averaged about 1 percent above a year earlier.

March sales: Revised March sales of fluid products in 63 regulated markets (58 Federal and 5 State) averaged 5 percent above the 3.4 billion pounds a year earlier. March 1971 included 1 less Sunday than in 1970.

Whole milk sales during March were up 3 percent from 2.7 billion pounds in March 1970.

Low-fat and skim milk sales for March 1971 were up 13 percent from the year-earlier total of 712 million pounds.

Milk and cream mixtures sales (mostly half and half) were 6 percent below the 1970 level of 37 million pounds. Cream sales for March were 1 percent below the year-earlier total of 22 million pounds.

Milk receipts: April receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 64 markets (60 Federal and 4 State) were up 5 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 1 percent from April 1970.

Milk production: May 1971 milk production for the United States was estimated at 11.2 billion pounds, 1 percent more than a year earlier. May output provided 1.75 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, the same as a year earlier, but above the 1.68 pounds the previous month.
