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MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: The early October prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$7.30 per hundredweight for about 150 markets, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This average was 4 cents above September and 16 cents above a year earlier. Gains from last month ranged from 6 cents in the New England and Mountain Regions to 1 cent in the Pacific Region. The East North Central declined 3 cents from last month.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 major cities in early October averaged 58.3 cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. The price was 0.2 cent above September and 0.4 cent above a year earlier.

Home-delivered prices: Prices for home-delivered milk averaged 68.4 cents per half gallon in early October for 25 major cities, unchanged from September but 0.9 cent above October 1971. The home-delivered prices represent list prices before deductions for quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK
FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary August sales: Preliminary August indications of sales of fluid dairy products in 63 marketing areas (58 Federal and 5 State) show an increase of 5 percent over a year earlier.

July sales: Revised July sales of fluid products in the 63 regulated markets averaged 1 percent below a year earlier.

Whole milk sales during July were 3 percent below the 2.4 billion pounds in July 1971.

Low-fat and skim milk sales for July 1972 were up 7 percent from the year earlier total of 782 million pounds.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half and half) were down 4 percent from the 34 million pounds sold in July 1971.

Sweet and sour cream sales in July averaged 4 percent below a year earlier when 22 million pounds were sold.

Milk receipts: August receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 65 markets (61 Federal and 4 State) were up 1 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 4 percent from August 1971.

Milk production: United States milk production in September was estimated at 9,494 million pounds, 1.4 percent more than a year ago. September output provided 1.51 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.55 pounds the previous month and 1.50 pounds in September 1971.
