

# FLUID MILK AND CREAM REPORT

NOVEMBER 1969

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## MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: November prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.92 per cwt. for about 155 markets--up 5 cents from October and 23 cents above a year earlier.

Regional averages ranged from unchanged to 9 cents higher than in October. Compared with a year earlier, regional prices ranged from 14 to 29 cents higher, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 cities during early November averaged about 55 cents per half-gallon for whole milk. This was up slightly from October as Pittsburgh, Kansas City, and Omaha prices increased 2 to 4 cents per half-gallon. The November average was  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cents above a year earlier.

Home-delivered prices: Half-gallon prices for home-delivered milk averaged nearly  $63\frac{1}{2}$  cents per half-gallon. This was about  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent above a month ago and 3 cents above a year earlier. Home-delivered prices represent list prices before quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS  
OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary September sales: Preliminary data for September on average daily sales of fluid dairy products in 65 marketing areas (60 Federal and 5 State) averaged 3 percent above a year earlier. September 1969 had one less Sunday than September 1968--this contributed to the increase in average daily sales. Total sales for the first 9 months of 1969 averaged about the same as a year earlier.

August sales: Total sales of fluid products for August in regulated markets (60 Federal and 5 State) averaged nearly 3 percent below a year earlier. The additional Sunday in August 1969 reduced average sales.

Whole milk sales in August were down nearly 6 percent from a year earlier.

Low-fat and skim milk sales in August were up 9 percent from a year earlier. Total sales for the first 9 months of 1969 averaged 12 percent above 1968 levels.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half and half) averaged nearly 10 percent below 1968. Sweet and sour cream sales were down 7 percent from August 1968.

Milk receipts: September receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 62 marketing areas (58 Federal and 4 State) were up 3 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for these same markets was down 4 percent from September 1968.

Milk production: U. S. milk production in October was estimated at 9.2 billion pounds--up 0.3 percent from a year earlier. October output provided 1.45 pounds of milk (for all uses) per person--down 0.7 percent from a year earlier. Daily average production during the first 10 months of the year was 0.7 percent less than in 1968.

October milk production equaled or surpassed a year earlier in all Atlantic States except New Jersey and Delaware. In the North Central States, production was above a year ago in Michigan and Wisconsin, unchanged in Ohio and Kansas and down elsewhere. In the South Central and Western Regions, production changes from October 1968 were mixed: up in 9 States, unchanged in 1 and down in 9 States.
