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# FLUID MILK AND CREAM REPORT

JANUARY 1970

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## MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: January prices paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.99 per cwt. for about 150 markets--up 1 cent from December 1969 and 29 cents above January 1969.

Regional averages ranged from 22 to 33 cents above a year earlier according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 cities during early January 1970 averaged nearly 57 cents per half gallon for whole milk, about 3 cents above a year earlier.

Home-delivered prices: Half gallon prices for home-delivered milk averaged slightly over 64 cents per half gallon. This was about  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent above a month ago and 3 cents above a year earlier. Home-delivered prices represent list prices before quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS  
OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary November sales: Preliminary data for November on average daily sales of fluid dairy products in 65 marketing areas (60 Federal and 5 State) averaged 3 percent less than a year earlier. November 1969 had one extra Sunday compared with November 1968-- this contributed to the decrease in average daily sales. Total sales for the January-November period of 1969 averaged about 0.5 percent above a year earlier.

October sales: Total sales of fluid products for October in regulated markets (60 Federal and 5 State) were 1 percent above a year earlier. October 1969 and October 1968 had the same number of sales days, excluding Sundays.

Whole milk sales in October were  $1\frac{1}{2}$  percent below a year earlier.

Low-fat and skim milk sales in October were up nearly 15 percent from a year earlier.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half and half) averaged 5 percent less than October 1968. Sweet and sour cream sales were down  $2\frac{1}{2}$  percent from October 1968.

Milk receipts: November receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 62 marketing areas (58 Federal and 4 State) were up 2 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 3 percent from November 1968.

Milk production: U. S. milk production during December was estimated at 9.2 billion pounds--down 0.2 percent from a year earlier. December output provided 1.45 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses--compared with 1.42 pounds in November and 1.47 pounds a year earlier.

Preliminary monthly estimates of milk production for 1969 totaled 116.2 billion pounds, 0.9 percent less than the 1968 total. Production was below a year earlier in all months of 1969 except August, September and October. The largest decreases occurred during the first 5 months of the year.
