

FLUID MILK AND CREAM REPORT

JULY 1969

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MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I Prices: The July price paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.74 per hundredweight for about 155 markets. This was up slightly from June and 16 cents above a year earlier. Regional averages were 20 cents or more above July 1968 in New England, Mid-Atlantic, and Pacific Regions, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 cities in early July averaged 54.9 cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This was about $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents above a year earlier and 4 cents above July 1967.

Home-delivered prices: Half gallon prices for home-delivered milk averaged $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents above a year earlier and nearly 5 cents above July 1967. The home delivered prices represent list prices before deductions for quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary May sales: Preliminary data on total sales of fluid dairy products during May for nearly 70 marketing areas averaged about the same as a year earlier.

April sales: Total sales of fluid products for April in regulated markets also averaged about the same as a year earlier.

Whole milk sales during April were down about 2 percent from 1968.

Low-fat and skim milk sales in April were up 11 percent from a year earlier. Sales of these products during the first four months of 1969 were up 12 percent from the same period of 1968.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half and half) averaged 7 percent below April 1968 and cream sales were down about 10 percent.

Milk receipts: May receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for about 65 marketing areas were up about 2 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 3 percent from May 1968.

Milk production: U. S. milk production during June was estimated at 10.8 billion pounds -- down about 1 percent from a year earlier. June output provided 1.77 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.80 pounds a year earlier.
