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# FLUID MILK AND CREAM REPORT

SEPTEMBER 1969

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## MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: The September price paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.83 per cwt. for about 155 markets--up 5 cents from August. In Virginia and Louisiana, Class I prices increased significantly--about 30 cents over last month.

September Class I milk price for reporting markets averaged 19 cents above a year earlier. Regional increases ranged from 6 cents in the West North Central Region to 27 cents in the South Atlantic.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 cities in early September averaged 54.9 cents per half-gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This was about the same as August but nearly 2 cents above a year earlier.

Home-delivered prices: Half-gallon prices for home-delivered milk averaged 62.7 cents per half-gallon. This was  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent above a month ago and nearly 3 cents above September 1968. Home-delivered prices represent list prices before deductions for quantity and other discounts.

## SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary July sales: Preliminary data on total sales of fluid dairy products during July 1969 for nearly 70 marketing areas averaged the same as a year earlier.

June sales: Total sales of fluid products for June in regulated markets averaged nearly one-half percent above a year earlier. Cumulative sales for the first half of 1969 also averaged about one-half percent above a year ago.

Whole milk sales were down  $2\frac{1}{2}$  percent from a year earlier in June and down 2 percent for the first half of the year.

Low-fat and skim milk sales in June were up 12 percent from a year earlier.

Milk and cream mixture sales (mostly half and half) averaged 5 percent below June 1968. For the first half of 1969, cream mixture sales were down 6 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Total sweet and sour cream sales in marketing areas for which comparable data are available were down 4 percent from June 1968. Total sales for the first 6 months of 1969 were 7 percent below a year earlier.

Milk receipts: July receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 65 marketing areas (57 Federal and 8 State) were up  $2\frac{1}{2}$  percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for these same markets was down about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  percent from July 1969.

Milk production: U. S. milk production during August was estimated at 9.6 billion pounds--up one-half percent from a year earlier. August output provided 1.52 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, compared with 1.53 a year earlier.
