ICE CREAM PRODUCTION

Ice cream production in the United States during June, estimated at 73,820,000 gallons, was 5 percent more than the enumerated total in June 1963 and 2 percent larger than the 1958-62 average for the month. Output in the first half of this year was 2 percent more than in the January-June period of 1963 and 6 percent greater than the 5-year average for these months. The seasonal gain from May to June was 13 percent, compared with 6 percent at this time a year carlier and 12 percent on the average in the 1958-62 period. Temperatures during June were normal or above in most of the country east of a line from northern Minnesota to the middle of South Dakota to the castern edge of Iowa and Missouri and westward to include most of Arkansas, the lower half of Texas and southern New Mexico. Below normal temperatures prevailed west of this line and in a strip along Lake Superior and the northern half of Lake Michigan. Also, cooler temperatures occurred in most of New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, and southward along the Middle Atlantic Coast; and the southern portions of the Gulf States.

Compared with June 1963, increases in ice cream production in all regions ranged from 1 percent in the East North Central to 9 percent in the West North Central. Output was 5 percent more in the North Atlantic Region and 8 percent larger in the South Atlantic. Production increased 7 percent in the Pacific States and 5 percent in both the South Central and the Mountain.

Compared with the 5-year average for June, production was unchanged in the East North Central States and 2 percent less in the Mountain. Increases were 3 percent in the Morth Atlantic Region, 4 percent in the South Atlantic, 5 percent in the West North Central, 1 percent in the South Central and 6 percent in the Pacific.

Revised ice cream estimates, by states, for January-May 1964 are shown on page 5. Inumerated data for 1963, by states and months, will be available about July 30 in annual release "Production of Nanufactured Dairy Products" which may be secured upon request to this office. All U.S. totals include production in Alaska and Hawaii.

ICE MILK PRODUCTION

Ice milk manufacture in the United States was estimated at 26,035,000 gallons, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This was 6 percent more than in June 1963, and 41 percent greater than the 1958-62 June average. Cumulative output in the first half of this year was 102,235,000 gallons: 6 percent larger than in the first sin months of 1963 and 46 percent greater than the 5-year average for the period.

Output gained 18 percent from May to June, compared with 12 percent in 1963 and 15 percent on the average in the 1958-62 period. Seasonal increases occurred in all regions of the country.

compared with June 1963, ice milk production decreased in the North Atlantic and the West North Central States, while it increased in all other regions.

SHERBET PRODUCTION

June production of sherbet in the United States at 5,370,000 gallons, was 7 percent larger than the enumerated total in June 1953 and 2 percent more than the 1950-62 average for the month. Total output in the first half of 1964 was 3 percent more than in the corresponding period last year, and 8 percent larger than the 1958-62 average.

Therbet production gained 20 percent between May and June. This compares with 14 percent in 1963 and the average of 18 percent in the previous five-year period. Compared with June 1963, production declined in the Mest North Central Region, but increased in all other regions. Output increased from May in all regions except the Mountain.

June production of Mellorine and other frozen desserts made with fats and oils other than milkfat in the United States was estimated at 5,555,000 gallons, the Crop Reporting Board reports. This was 11 percent more than the enumerated total in June 1963 and 10 percent greater than the 1958-62 average for the month. Cumulative output the first half of this year was up 2 percent from the corresponding period in 1963 and 14 percent from the 5-year average.

Compared with May, the 17-percent gain this year contrasts with a 1-percent loss at this time in 1963. The average seasonal gain was 12 percent in the 1958-62 period. Output declined sharply in South Carolina and Alabama. Production was steady in Arizona, while it increased in all other producing states. Compared with June 1963, output decreased in South Carolina, Alabama, Oklahoma, and California. Increases occurred in all remaining states except Arizona, where production was unchanged.

WATER ICE PRODUCTION

Water ice production in the United States was placed at 5,895,000 gallons in June - 6 percent more than in June 1963 and 4 percent above the 1958-62 average for the month. The January-June output was 1 percent above the first six months of 1963 and 3 percent above the average.

Production of water ices advanced 23 percent from May to June, compared with 17 percent a year earlier and 18 percent on the average in the 1958-62 period. Gains occurred in all regions of the country. Compared with June 1963, output was off moderately in the West, but increased in all other regions.
