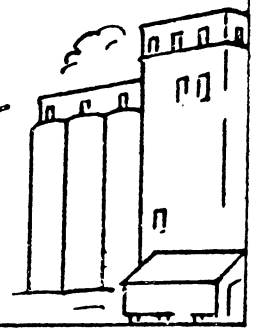

Agriculture - Washington

RECORD STOCKS OF MOST GRAINS FOR APRIL 1

Stocks in all storage positions on April 1, 1955 were record large for corn - with 2,115 million bushels, for wheat - 1,212 million bushels, and barley - 207 million bushels. The off-farm total of 121 million bushels of sorghum grain -- farm stocks are not estimated on April 1 -- is also largest of record. The 621 million bushels of oats almost equals the record and the 19.9 million bushels of rye are the largest April 1 stocks since 1944. The tonnage of feed grains in all positions is by far the largest in the 13-year series available for April 1. These totals were assembled by the Crop Reporting Board, bringing together commercial stocks at terminals, as reported by the Grain Division of the Agricultural Marketing Service; grains reported by Commodity Credit Corporation as owned and stored in bins, ships and other storages under CCC control, and in transit to ports; estimates of the Crop Reporting Board for stocks on farms, and at merchant mills and interior mills, elevators and warehouses. Comparison of these stocks with those for January 1, 1955 indicate relatively small disappearance of corn, partly offset by heavy disappearance of other feed grains.

Stocks of over 1,212 million bushels of wheat stored in all positions on April 1, 1955 are the largest for that date in the comparable series beginning in 1935. This total is over 7 percent larger than a year earlier, the previous record holdings for April 1. Current stocks are 253 million bushels less than the January 1, 1955 stocks.

Off-farm stocks of nearly 1,005 million bushels of wheat, one-fifth larger than a year earlier, are a record total for the date. Of this total, about nine-tenths was either owned by the Commodity Credit Corporation or was warehouse-stored wheat under Government commodity loans. Stocks of wheat on farms, at about 208 million bushels, were nearly a third less than the record total a year earlier and the smallest April 1 stocks since 1952. About three-fifths of the total wheat on farms was under Government commodity loan.

The off-farm wheat total includes 101 million bushels at merchant mills, 429 million bushels in interior mills, elevators and warehouses and 352 million bushels of commercial stocks at terminals. The Commodity Credit Corporation had nearly 123 million bushels of wheat, a record total, stored in bins under CCC control, aboard ships in the "mothball" fleet, and in transit to ports. Other Government owned wheat is included in the estimate for the position where stored.

The 19.9 million bushels of rye stored in all positions on April 1, 1955 is the largest for that date since 1944 and exceeds the April 1 stocks a year earlier by nearly 7 percent. Of this total, nearly 8 million bushels or 38 percent was stored on farms. Stocks of rye in bins under Commodity Credit Corporation control on April 1 totaled only 98,000 bushels. Rye held in all other off-farm storage totaled 12.1 million bushels which compares with 13.1 million bushels in similar positions on April 1, 1954.

Corn stocks of 2,115 million bushels in all storage positions on April 1 reached a new high mark for the date, about 6 percent larger than the previous record a year ago. Farm stocks of 1,410 million bushels were only a little smaller than the relatively large reserves of the last two years. The off-farm portion, however, was much larger than on any previous April 1, chiefly because of the 513 million bushels owned and stored in their own bins by Commodity Credit Corporation. The 56 million bushels of commercial stocks at terminals was a relatively large quantity for that position. The 136 million bushels at interior mills, elevators and warehouses was by far the largest in 13 years of record for April 1. From the October 1, 1954 supply of 3,572 million bushels of grain corn, disappearance to April 1 is computed at 1,457 million bushels, much less than usual for the 6-month period. In the January-March quarter, disappearance is indicated at 687 million bushels, nearly as large as in that period of 1954, but less than usual for the quarter.

Oats stocks of 621 million bushels were over a fourth larger than a year ago and almost up to the record for April 1 in 1946. The farm-stored portion of 553 million bushels is largest since 1949 and third largest of record. Making up the record-large off-farm portion of 68 million bushels are relatively large stocks of 18 million bushels at terminals, 1.4 million bushels owned and stored by CCC in their own bins and record large April 1 stocks of 48.5 million bushels of oats at interior mills, elevators and warehouses. Disappearance of 395 million bushels of oats since January 1, 1955 is much larger than usual for the quarter, and has been exceeded only in 1946.

Barley stocks of nearly 207 million bushels in all positions were the largest of record and two-thirds larger than holdings on April 1 a year ago. Stocks of about 117 million bushels on farms were the largest since 1943 and 56 percent larger than on this date last year. Record large holdings of about 68 million bushels were also reported at interior mills, elevators and warehouses. Holdings of 21.2 million bushels at terminal points were the largest since 1951. Disappearance of 77 million bushels during the January-March quarter was the largest since 1951.

For sorghum grains, stocks data are available on April 1 for only the off-farm positions. The off-farm total of 120.6 million bushels is the largest of record and more than three times the holdings in these positions last year. Of this total, 82.1 millions were at interior mills, elevators and warehouses, and 38.4 million bushels at terminal points, while only 90,000 bushels were stored in CCC bins.
