STOCKS OF GRAIN, OCTOBER 1, 1944

Grain stocks in all storage positions, on and off farms, on October 1, 1944 were made up of 1,106,645,000 bushels of wheat, 238,349,000 bushels of old corn from the crop of 1943 and earlier years, 1,032,054,000 bushels of oats, 260,508,000 bushels of barley and 36,635,000 bushels of rye. Compared with a year earlier, current stocks of wheat are only slightly smaller than the 1,111 million bushels on October 1, 1943; corn stocks are only about three-fifths as large as the 388 million bushels a year ago; oats stocks are slightly above the 996 million bushels a year ago; barley stocks are four-fifths as large as the 328.5 million bushels a year ago; and rye stocks are about two-thirds as large as the 54.5 million bushels on October 1, 1943.

Disappearance of corn between July 1 and October 1 was about 369 million bushels, compared with 451 million bushels during the same quarter of 1943. Computing supplies on July 1 as the stocks on that date plus estimated production in the same year, stocks as of October 1 reveal disappearance to that date. Between July 1 and October 1, 1944, disappearance of wheat amounts to about 317 million bushels, compared with 347 million in the same period of 1943. Disappearance of other grains for the July-October quarter of 1944 and 1943 are, respectively, — oats, 370 and 409 million bushels; barley, 103 and 114 million bushels; rye, 22 and 23 million bushels.

These data, as shown in the preceding table, are compiled from the usual sources. Stocks on farms and in interior mills, elevators and warehouses are estimated by the Crop Reporting Board. For corn, oats, barley and rye the coverage of the Crop Reporting Board is extended to include not only the usual interior plants, but also such other storages as oilseed processors, breveries, distilleries, bean cleaning and corn processing plants and merchant mills. For wheat, stocks in merchant mills as enumerated by the Bureau of the Census are adjusted to completeness. The grand total includes stocks reported by the War Food Administration at the 46 terminal markets and grain stored by Commodity Credit Corporation in their own steel and wooden bins.

Stocks of corn, oats, barley and rye shown by States below, are estimates for the off-farm positions covered by the Crop Reporting Board. These positions include all off-farm storages except those at the 46 terminal markets and the steel and wooden bins of Commodity Credit Corporation.
