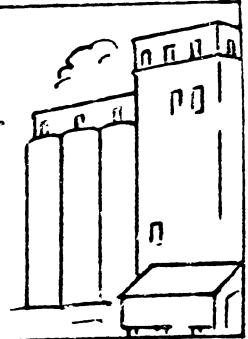

CORN CARRYOVER AND WHEAT STOCKS RECORD LARGE

Wheat stocks of nearly 1.7 billion bushels are the largest of record, equivalent to domestic needs for more than two years. The carryover of corn exceeds that of any previous season. With relatively large stocks of oats, barley and sorghum grain, the tonnage of the 4 feed grains represented by these October 1 stocks - 55.7 million tons - is largest by far in the 8 years for which such data are available. These data on stocks in all positions are assembled by the Crop Reporting Board from the various sources: - stocks at terminals reported to the Grain Division of the Agricultural Marketing Service; grains reported by Commodity Credit Corporation as owned and stored in bins and other storages under CCC control and in transit; estimates of the Crop Reporting Board for stocks on farms, at merchant mills and at interior mills, elevators, and warehouses.

Stocks of 1,682 million bushels of wheat stored in all positions on October 1 are the largest for the date in the comparable series beginning in 1935. This total is 9 percent larger than a year earlier, the previous record holdings, and nearly 50 percent larger than average. The stocks total exceeds 1954 production by 75 percent, reflecting the record large carryover of old wheat on July 1.

Off-farm wheat stocks of 1,245 million bushels, one-fourth larger than a year earlier, are a record total for the date, with holdings in each of the off-farm positions at a record level. In contrast, farm stocks of 437 million bushels for October 1 are the smallest for that date since 1940 and nearly one-fourth less than a year earlier. This decrease in farm stocks results largely from the smaller wheat crop harvested in 1954.

The off-farm total includes 423 million bushels at terminals, nearly one-fourth more than a year earlier, the previous record. The 537 million bushels held in interior mills, elevators and warehouses on October 1 compares with the previous record holdings of 459 million bushels a year earlier. Merchant mill wheat stocks totaled 159 million bushels, well above the 134 million bushels held a year earlier and 4 million bushels larger than the previous record stocks for that position on October 1, 1941. The Commodity Credit Corporation had 126 million bushels of wheat, a record total, stored in bins under CCC control, aboard ships in the "moth-ball fleet," and in transit to ports. Other government owned wheat is included in the estimate for the position where stored.

Rye stocks of 32.5 million bushels stored in all positions on October 1, 1954, are 57 percent larger than stocks a year earlier and the largest October 1 holdings in 10 years. Farm stocks of rye at 14½ million bushels, the largest since October 1, 1943, account for nearly half of the total stocks. Stocks of rye at terminals totaled 12.0 million bushels, nearly double the quantity held in that position a year earlier. Other off-farm storages held 5.9 million bushels of rye, compared with 4.0 million bushels a year earlier.

The corn carryover of 918 million bushels in all positions on October 1 is largest of record. It is nearly a fifth larger than the 769 million bushels in storage a year ago and tops the previous record in 1950 by 73 million bushels. The farm stocks portion of 358 million bushels is 28 million larger than a year ago, but has been exceeded 6 times previously. However, with 468 million bushels of CCC-owned corn stored in their own bins, the off-farm portion is by far the largest of record. Stocks of over 74 million bushels at interior mills, elevators, and warehouses have been exceeded only twice previously and the 18 million bushels at terminals is more than in most recent years. Disappearance in the July-September quarter is computed at 485 million bushels and for the 1953-54 feeding season

at 2,720 million bushels of grain corn. This is slightly more than in the 1952-53 season, but less than in any of the three seasons before that.

Oats stocks of 1,306 million bushels have been exceeded on this date only in 1945. At more than a fifth larger than a year earlier, current stocks reflect the near-record 1954 production. Off-farm stocks of 114 million bushels are largest of record and farm stocks of 1,191 million are second largest.

Barley stocks of 354 million bushels on October 1 are the largest in the 12 years of comparable record, also reflecting heavy 1954 production. Farm stocks of 225 million bushels are the largest since 1943 and the off-farm portion of 129 million bushels has never been exceeded.

For Sorghum Grain, the carryover of 22 million bushels is larger than in most seasons, having been exceeded only in 1950 and 1951. It is about three times as large as the 7.3 million carried over a year ago. The current total includes 3.2 million bushels on farms, 11.4 million at interior mills, elevators, and warehouses, 5.2 million at terminals and 2.3 million bushels of CCC-owned sorghum grain in their own bins. No identifiable new crop sorghum grain is included in these carryover stocks.
