## STOCKS OF GRAIN, JULY 1, 1944

Grains stored in all storage positions, on and off farms, on July 1, 1944 included 316,368,000 bushels of wheat, 606,895,000 bushels of corn, 210,123,000 bushels of oats, 76,108,000 bushels of barley and 31,033,000 bushels of rye, These stocks of wheat show a disappearance of about 227 million bushels since April 1, and are 49 percent smaller than the 622 million bushels on July 1, 1943. Stocks of corn were reduced by 555 million bushels since April 1, and are 28 percent smaller than a year ago. Oats disappeared in the amount of 235 million bushels since April 1 and stocks are 20 percent smaller than on July 1, 1943. Barley stocks on July 1 were 58 million bushels less than on April 1 and 37 percent smaller than a year ago. Rye stocks declined 5 million bushels since April 1 and are 34 percent smaller than on July 1, 1943.

These data, as shown in the table below, are compiled from the usual sources. Stocks on farms and in interior mills, elevators and warehouses are estimated by the Crop Reporting Board. For corn, oats, barley and rye the coverage of the Crop Reporting Board is extended to include not only the usual interior plants, but also such other storages (Continued on other side of this sheet.)

as oilseed processors, breweries, distilleries, bean cleaning and corn processing plants and merchant mills. For wheat, stocks in merchant mills as enumerated by the Bureau of the Census are adjusted to completeness. The grand total includes stocks reported by the War Food Administration at the 46 terminal markets and grain stored by Commodity Credit Corporation in their own steel and wooden bins.

Stocks of corn, oats, barley and rye shown by States below, are estimates for off-farm positions covered by the Crop Reporting Board. These positions include all off-farm storages except those at the 46 terminal markets and the steel and wooden bins of Commodity Credit Corporation.
