STOCKS OF GRAIN, JANUARY 1, 1944

Stocks of wheat in all storage positions on January 1, 1944 amounted to 843,096,000 bushels; of corn, 2,048,951,000 bushels; of oats, 759,169,000 bushels; of barley, 215,045,000 bushels; and of rye, 47,209,000 bushels. Stocks on farms and in interior mills, elevators, and warehouses are estimates of the Crop Reporting Board. For corn, oats, barley, and rye these estimates include also such other storages as oilseed crushers, breweries, distilleries, bean cleaning and corn processing plants and similar miscellaneous storages, as well as merchant mills. For wheat, the estimates include the stocks in merchant mills as enumerated by the Bureau of the Census and adjusted to completeness, with other positions estimated by the Crop Reporting Board. To reach the grand total there are also included stocks reported by the War Food Administration at the 46 terminal markets and grains stored by Commodity Credit Corporation in their own steel and wooden bins.

Stocks in the various positions, which were combined to obtain total stocks are shown in the table below, with comparisons by quarters representing all similar aggregate data available.

Aggregate stocks of wheat, corn, oats, barley, and rye on January 1 in off-farm storage positions amounted to 665,069,000 bushels, equivalent to about 40 percent of all commercial storage space which totaled 1,667,192,000 bushels as of April 1, 1943.

Stocks of corn, cats, barley, and rye, shown by States below, are estimates for the off-farm positions covered by the Crop Reporting Board. These positions include all off-farm storages except those at the 46 terminal markets and the steel and wooden bins of Commodity Credit Corporation.
